Subject: Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District Upgrade Report and
Assessment Roll Resolution

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) adopt the attached assessment roll resolution to fund upgraded streetlights in the Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District, which will be increased in intensity from 6,300 and 9,500 to 16,000 lumen sodium vapor (LSV).

Scope

This special taxing district lies within Commission Districts Two (2) and Three (3) and will upgrade the existing street lighting facilities to 16,000 LSV.

Fiscal Impact/ Funding Source

The Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District was created on October 29, 1963, by Resolution No. 9199. Over the years, the intensity of the District's streetlights has increased from 4,500 lumen mercury vapor to 6,300 and 9,500 LSV streetlights. This change allowed for a higher level of light intensity, and at the same time represented savings for the District since sodium vapor streetlights use less energy to operate.

Staff performed a cost and feasibility study for upgrading the existing streetlights to 16,000 LSV. In staff's opinion, and based on the present District configuration and spacing of poles, this upgrade will result in acceptable lighting levels without the addition of new light poles. The upgraded streetlights will provide benefits to all property within the District in excess of the total amount of special assessments to be levied.


The capital cost to upgrade the District's 820 eligible streetlights is estimated to be \$28,700 and will be paid from the District's cash reserves. In addition, a total annual cost difference of \$8,364 will be collected through the District's rate for the first year following the upgrade. The annual rate per front foot following implementation of the streetlight upgrade will be \$0.4789 for the first year. This increase in assessment is approximately 5% above the present assessment rate of \$0.4563 per front foot. Typical estimated annual assessments following the upgrade will be \$23.95 for an interior lot and for \$39.27 for a corner lot, an increase from \$22.82 and \$37.42 respectively.

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This assessment roll resolution is submitted for consideration in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 02-12 adopted by the Board on January 29, 2002. The ordinance established a procedure to increase streetlight intensity in existing special taxing districts to meet today's street lighting special taxing district standards. On October 10, 2006, in response to District residents' requests, Audrey Edmonson, District 3 Commissioner and Dorrin D. Rolle, District 2 Commissioner, requested that the feasibility of upgrading the Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District be reviewed and the Board approved Resolution No. R-1168-06 to that effect.

Track Record/Monitoring

Contingent upon BCC approval of this District, the Public Works Department's Special Taxing Districts Division will monitor the Florida Power and Light Company's agreement, installation and billing process. It is expected that the Florida Power and Light Company will complete the engineering and replacement of the street lighting fixtures by December 2009. Since the initial assessment increase for the upgrade does not exceed the 15% ceiling specified in Ordinance 02-12, public hearing notices will not be mailed to the approximately 4,950 affected property owners in the Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District.

RESOLUTION NO. R-646-09

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE UPGRADING OF STREET LIGHTING SERVICES AT A COMBINED CAPITAL AND FIRST YEAR RATE INCREASE COST OF \$37,064 AND ADOPTING A REVISED ASSESSMENT ROLL PROVIDING FOR ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS AGAINST REAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN BOUNDARIES OF A SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT KNOWN AS BROWNSVILLE STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, ORDINANCE NO. 02-12, AND RESOLUTION NO. 9199

WHEREAS, with the adoption of Ordinance No. 02-12 the Board of County Commissioners established a procedure for upgrading the level of street lighting services within existing special taxing districts in Miami-Dade County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Brownsville Street Lighting Improvement District created by Resolution No. 9199 currently provides street lighting services which may be upgraded to meet current County standards; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. R-1168-06, the Board of County Commissioners directed the County Manager to perform a study to determine the cost to upgrade the existing 6,300 and 9,500 lumen sodium vapor streetlights to higher intensity levels; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager, after making appropriate investigations, surveys, plans and specifications, compiled and filed with the Board of County Commissioners his written report and recommendations setting forth a description of the upgraded street lighting services to be provided and maintained within the district, an estimate of the cost of constructing and maintaining such improvements, an estimate of the annual expense of maintaining and operating such improvements, and setting forth his recommendations concerning the need for and desirability of the requested upgraded services, the ability of the affected property to bear special assessments for financing the cost of maintaining such project, and an estimate of the amount to be assessed against each front

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foot of the benefited property within the district, and expressing his opinion that the property to be specially assessed will be benefited in excess of the revised special assessments to be levied; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Board of County Commissioners from such report of the County Manager and other investigations that the upgraded streetlight services will be of special benefit to all property within the district and that the total amount of the special assessments to be levied would not be in excess of such special benefit; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 02-12, the County Manager caused a revised assessment roll reflecting the increased costs associated with installation of 16,000 lumen sodium vapor streetlights to be prepared and filed with the Clerk of the County Commission and pursuant to notice published and posted within the special taxing district, the County Commission held a public hearing on this date upon the revised assessment roll submitted by the County Manager, and all interested persons were afforded the opportunity to present their objections, if any, with respect to their assessments on such revised assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration, the County Commission found and determined that the assessments shown on the revised assessment roll were generally in direct proportion to the special benefits accruing to the respective parcels of real property appearing on said revised assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, when finally approved and confirmed pursuant to Ordinance No. 02-12 and Chapter 18 of the Miami-Dade County Code, as was done with the prior special assessments of this district, the increased special assessments will be placed on the November 2009, and subsequent real property tax bills and that, if these special assessments are not paid when due, the properties on which the special assessments are levied will be respectively subject to the same collection procedures as for ad valorem taxes, including possible loss of title,



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The upgraded improvements and services to be provided within this special taxing district will consist of the following:

Installation of 16,000 lumen sodium vapor streetlights mounted on existing poles located within the street right-of-way.

The installation of the upgraded improvements and services will be accomplished pursuant to an agreement between Miami-Dade County and the Florida Power and Light Company.

Section 2. That the said revised assessment roll (a copy of which is made a part hereof by reference) is approved, adopted and confirmed pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 02-12 and Chapter 18 of the Miami-Dade County Code.

Section 3. The Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners is directed to deliver to the Finance Director, on or before June 4, 2009, a copy of the revised assessment roll, and to cause a duly certified copy of this resolution, together with the revised assessment roll, to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Section 4. All assessments made upon said revised assessment roll shall constitute a special assessment lien upon the real property so assessed from the date of the confirmation of such assessments, in accordance with the provisions of Section 18-14(8) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Section 5. All assessments shall be payable in accordance with Section 18-14(7) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. As authorized by Section 197.363, Florida Statutes, all special assessments levied and imposed under the provisions of Resolution No. 9199, and this Resolution, shall be collected, subject to the provisions of Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, in the same manner and at the same time as ad valorem taxes. Unless paid when due, such assessments shall be deemed delinquent and payment thereof may be enforced by means of the procedures provided by the

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provision of Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, and/or Section 18-14(8) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner **Audrey M. Edmonson**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Dorrin D. Rolle** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

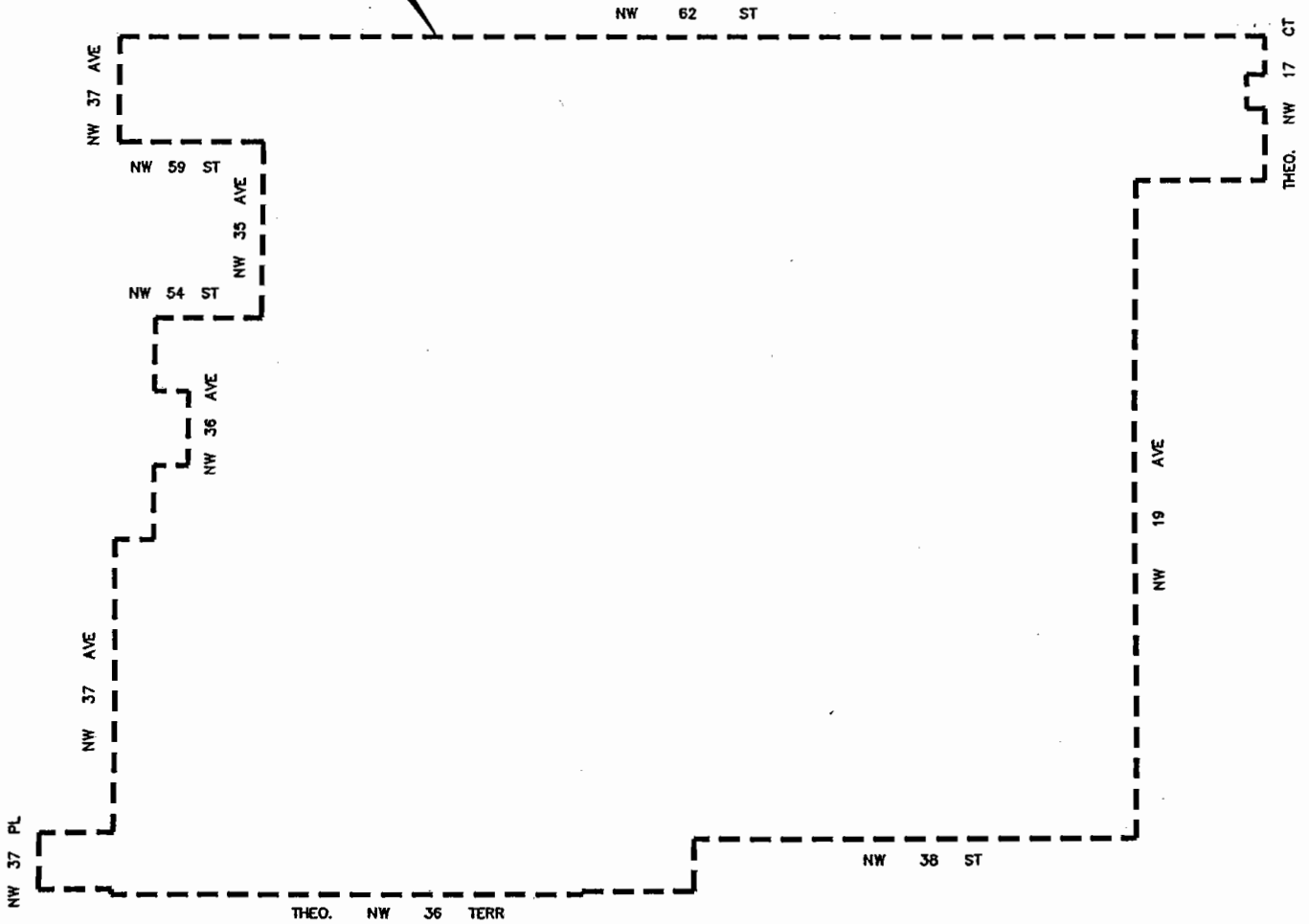
