

**Naranja Lakes CRA Initiative**  
**Monthly Progress Report**

The following is a synopsis of the police enforcement and community policing actions provided to the Naranja Lakes CRA boundaries from Monday, April 18, 2011 to Sunday, May 15, 2011:

- At the onset of the initiative, an up to date analysis was conducted of the areas of concern to determine the most active days and hours of the week to provide the most efficient coverage.
- A total of 38 four-hour roving patrols details and 7 enforcement sweeps were conducted during this monthly period as an initiative. As a result, the initiative produced the following totals:
  1. A total of 13 arrests/apprehensions were made of which 8 warrant arrests, 3 traffic arrests, and 2 misdemeanor arrests.
  2. A total of 95 traffic citations (65 HVM, 29 NHMV, & 1 Parking).
  3. A total of 3 person's message recoveries.
  4. A total of 207 Field Interview Reports were written by officers who conducted a stop of an individual who warranted concerns to document there information for future reference.
  5. A total of 2 truants were apprehended and returned to their school.
  6. A total of 27 career criminals were stopped and documented.
  7. A total of 428 citizen contacts were initiative and 45 business contacts.

**Community Highlights:**

On Thursday, April 21, 2011, an Easter Egg Hunt event was hosted at the CRA building by the MDPD, CRT/NRU police officers in partnership with Commissioner Bell's staff. The event, in addition to inviting our CRA kids, also provided the opportunity for approximately 100 kids from our local homeless shelter to attend thanks to the generosity of Commissioner Bell who provided the funds for their bus transportation. The fair was a total success with an estimated 400 plus people attending, mostly kids. These families and their kids were provided with popcorn, candy, snow cones, cotton candy, ice cream, drinks, balloons, cupcakes, and other treats while enjoying a positive mentoring experience with our officers. The event hosted a helicopter, DARE race car, an exotic animal petting zoo, bounce houses, an Easter Bunny, face painting, cupcake decoration, an egg hunt, DJ music, My Gym obstacle course, and other attractions. It was our goal to leave a positive impact in the life experiences of these kids in order to foster future bonds of trust with our police officers, public officials, and local businesses. Judging from the many smiling faces, I believe we reached our goal.
