The first leg of the mission is Nairobi, Kenya [April 3 - 7, 2005] and subsequently, Kampala, Uganda [April 7 - 9, 2005]. U.S. citizens require a valid passport, visa and confirmed roundtrip ticket for travel to both countries.

IMMUNIZATION

Ensure that your vaccination is completed no later than 2 weeks before travel. Immunization against yellow Fever, Typhoid and Cholera are highly recommended. Anti-Malaria prevention medications are also recommended. For required vaccines please contact your physician or the Center for Disease Control www.cdc.gov/travel/eafrica.htm.

Additional Tips

- ▶ Please pack lightly. Airlines allow 2 pieces of luggage per passenger with no more than 70lbs each.
- ▶ Each passenger is also allowed one carry-on piece [20lbs] and a personal item on board.
- ▶ Bring extra copies of your organization's profile or catalog, brochures, or product samples.
- ▶ Don't forget your business cards!
- ▶ A small flash light with extra batteries is very handy.
- ▶ Prescription medications: make sure you have enough to last during your trip, as well as a copy of the prescription.
- ▶ Don't forget your camera with extra batteries and films.
- ▶ Bring six extra passport photos.
- ▶ Make and keep in a separate place, photocopies of your passport and ticket or itinerary.
- ▶ Antibacterial hand sanitizer is a recommended.
- ▶ Insect Repellent containing DEET is highly recommended.
- ▶ A small calculator and battery-operated alarm clock would be handy too.
- ▶ Avoid excess or flashy jeweleries.
- ▶ Remember your adapter or converter for small appliances: Voltage Note: USA = 110/120v 50 cycles; East Africa = 220/240v 50cycles.
- ▶ Always remember before you eat anything: boil it, cook it, peel it, or forget it!
