The Miami-Dade Beacon Council considers a company to be an active project if the company is in a targeted industry sector or is considering

Miami-Dade as a place to locate or expand its operations and will be creating new jobs and committing new capital into the area.

A project is considered completed once all Beacon Council services are provided and the company acknowledges receiving those services and certifies the expected level of new job creation and new capital investment being made in Miami-Dade County.

In fiscal year 2016-2017 (October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017), The Beacon Council assisted 46 companies in establishing new and/or expanding existing operations in Miami-Dade County. Assistance provided to these companies includes:

Site Selection, Permitting/Licenses, Employee Relocation Services, Research & Market Analysis, Business Contacts & Referrals, General Community Information, Enterprise/Empowerment Zone Benefits, Procurement of Financing, State and Local Incentives: Qualified Target Industry (QTI) Tax Refund, Targeted Job Incentive Fund (TJIF) Tax Refund, Manufacturing Sales Tax Exemption, Labor/Training Programs, such Quick Response Training (QRT).

Building our community: On a daily basis The Miami-Dade Beacon Council is answering questions and providing services and assistance to our business community. We do this by conducting business visitations, marketing, small business workshops, making business to business connections and more.

We diversify and build our industry base through various initiatives and task force's such as 6 industry committees, small business committee, international committee and urban initiatives task force.

We support the entrepreneurial eco-system in various ways through the attraction of venture capital and angel investment, through connect and grow initiatives where connections are made for entrepreneurs with larger corporates of interest and through support given to the Miami Innovation Working Group (MWIG) which is composed of local Accelerators, Incubators, Maker Labs, Innovation Centers and shared space.

The Miami-Dade Beacon Council hosts international delegations from across the world and plans and participates in numerous foreign direct investment recruitment conferences and missions. Further, The Miami-Dade Beacon Council maintains relationships with companies, consultants, and partners that help further the cause of building and diversifying the economic base of Miami-Dade County and the regions.

The Miami-Dade Beacon Council through The Beacon Council Economic Development Foundation, Inc. took the lead role in developing One Community One Goal (OCOG)Target Industry Strategic Plan (2012-2017). It is a community-wide effort that provides a unified vision to create an environment where significant job creation occurs with a focus on new higher-paying jobs in target industries, and touches upon the advocation of other community assets that are necessary to maintain economic prosperity. The Plan serves to coordinate activities for positive economic development. OCOG process is designed to be holistic and implementation requires involvement by a broad spectrum of Miami-Dade County organizations. The Miami-Dade Beacon Council is the steward of the plan.

Seven target industries were identified as having the greatest potential for growth, including creating high-wage and high-skilled jobs and for each target industry, a set of niche sectors were identified.
