People's Transportation Plan

Summary

This report provides a recap of activities related to the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) for the 90-day period beginning January 1, 2007 through March 31, 2007. Listings of previous and life-to-date accomplishments are available at <u>miamidade.gov/citt</u>. The implementation of the PTP continues with accelerated planning for projects and improvements included in the PTP.

CITT Member Appointments:

Marc A. Buoniconti, District 7 and Mayor Linda Zilber, District 4 were sworn in at the February 28, 2007 Trust meeting. This marks the second term for both members.

CITT Member Resignations:

Henry Lee Givens, District 9 resigned on March 22, 2007. Recruiting to fill this vacancy will begin in April, 2007.

Miami-Dade Transit Corridors

North Corridor

- The FTA issued a favorable (Medium overall) annual New Starts rating for the project on February 6, 2007.
- The FEIS was approved by FTA on February 22, 2007.
- The Notice of Availability for the FEIS was published in the Federal Register on March 9, 2007, for a circulation period of thirty (30) days. The FEIS was distributed to the list of recipients, is available for review at the Main Public Library and the North Regional Public Library, and has been advertised in local newspapers.
- The current Record of Decision date has been delayed until April 27, 2007. This is due to a request by the FTA to incorporate the latest ridership and project cost information contained in the New Starts Report submitted in August 2006, into the FEIS. FTA had previously indicated that the two documents could stand alone. However, they reversed their previous decision due to the magnitude of the project cost estimate changes since the last reporting cycle. This will provide the public with the latest ridership and project cost estimates during the FEIS circulation period.
- The current schedule update for this project reflects a completion date of November 2014.

MIC-Earlington Heights

- On February 21, 2007, MDT authorized URS to resume final design work on the portions of the
 project that were previously on hold. The suspension of design commenced in mid-November
 2006, for the Metrorail MIC Station, Metrobus Plaza and a portion of the guideway in and
 approaching the MIC station. URS concentrated their efforts on progressing final design on all
 aspects of the project that were not subject to the partial suspension of design. This included
 the 60% review comments resolution and the 60% cost estimate.
- The Island Shipping Lines property on South River Drive (Parcel No. 312) was acquired on January 19, 2007. To date, eight (8) parcels have been acquired by MDT and twelve (12) parcels have been acquired by MDX for joint use by MDT. There are a total of thirty-six (36) parcels required for the project.
- The demolition of buildings in Parcels 134 and 135 was awarded on June 12, 2006, based on the favorable response from FDOT regarding partially funding the building demolition work. The BCC approved the MDX Demolition Agreement on March 8, 2007.

- The Artist Orientation for the five artists short-listed for the Art-in-Public Places component of the project was held on March 13, 2007.
- Phase II Environmental Assessments (EA) were completed on three of the Parcels by MDT. These EA's are under review by the Project Team for possible site contamination issues.
- The current projected completion date for this project is July 2011.

East-West Corridor (MIC TO FIU)

- A brainstorming session was held regarding the East-West Corridor Cost Effectiveness Alignment options on February 5, 2007, and a follow-up meeting was held on February 28, 2007.
- MDT sent the Citizen's and Business Advisory Committee (CBAC) appointment letters and we received confirmation from eleven future participants. Fourteen members are required for a quorum.
- A travel survey was conducted of patrons attending the Miami-Dade County Fair and Exposition on March 23, 24 and 28, 2007.
- The current projected completion date for this project is July 2016.

South Dade (MPO Project)

 The Southlink Study is complete. The MPO will set up a meeting to formally transfer the project to the MDT Systems Development Division for planning development now that the new Systems Development Chief has begun work due to the retirement of the existing Division Chief.

Kendall (MPO Project)

- The Kendall-Link Tier II study detailed evaluation analysis continued for the Metrorail extension along the HEFT, the Metrorail extension along Kendall Drive, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) along Kendall Drive and the Diesel Multiple Unit (DMU) along the CSX corridor. Two open houses are planned for the public to review the Kendall-Link Study on April 24 and 25, 2007.
- An amendment to the original PSA was negotiated to provide additional scope of work services
 related to the integration of the Southwest Corridor with the Kendall Corridor. The PSA
 amendment was approved by the Transportation Planning Council on June 12, 2006, and by
 the MPO Board on June 22, 2006. The schedule for completion of this work is set for May 31,
 2007.

Baylink

 Work on the corridor is on hold. The corridor will be re-evaluated for development with possible funding available commencing in 2016.

Northeast (FDOT Project)

- FDOT submitted in December 2006, the Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) to FTA and a sectional Record of Decision is anticipated in May 2007.

Miami-Dade Transit Updates

New Hires:

 In keeping with the PTP's promise of creating more transit-related jobs, MDT has hired 13 new employees during the first quarter of 2007 bringing the total of new hires to 1829 since November 2002.

Metrorail Rehabilitation:

- The price of the solicitation for Metrorail vehicle rehabilitation has been negotiated and is currently being considered for award.
- MDT is working with the Miami-Dade County Department of Procurement Management for a
 bid award to complete the Heating, Ventilation and Air-Conditioning (HVAC) overhaul to begin in
 November 2007. The Technical Specifications and General Provisions are completed and the
 RFP 558 has been originated. The overhaul of the HVAC and the propulsion equipment on the
 Metrorail cars will ensure effective and reliable operations until the new cars are placed in
 service by 2010.

Metromover Replacement Update:

- The original 12 Metromover vehicles purchased in 1984 have reached their 20-years of useful life and will be replaced with new sleek design with interiors that will reflect a more innovative and futuristic appearance.
- MDT has completed its negotiations with Bombardier Transportation for 12 new vehicles, including an option to purchase 17 additional vehicles. Acceptance of the 12 new vehicles is expected by September 2008.
- Exterior wrapping of Metromover vehicles will be completed by May 2007. Twenty-one (21) of the Twenty-nine (29) mover cars have been wrapped in the County colors.

- Floor replacements of Metromover vehicles will be completed by the end of June 2007.
- Completion of the HVAC overhaul on the Phase II Metromover vehicles is anticipated for December 2007.
- Completion of the door overhaul on the Phase II Metromover vehicles is anticipated for June 2007.

Buses:

- Prior to the passage of the PTP, MDT operated 705 buses. Since then, MDT has increased the fleet by 328 buses, bringing the current fleet to 825 large 40-foot buses, 13 large 45-foot over-the-road buses, and 195 small 30-foot buses for a total of 1033 buses.
- MDT is currently in the process of accepting 75 small 32' buses and concurrently retiring buses that are to be replaced. The actual total fleet size varies from day to day during this process.

Golden Passport/Patriot Program:

- During the second quarter of FY 2007 (January 1 March 31, 2007), there were 2,340 Golden Passports issued to customers age 65 and older, 977 Golden Passports for customers under 65 years of age and 181 Patriot Passports issued to eligible customers. To date, there are 169,658 Golden Passport Patron accounts.
- In November 2002, there were 55,404 active Golden Passport accounts. From November 2002 to March 31, 2007, there were 114,254 additional Golden and Patriot Passports issued; including 30,099 to customers under age 65. This represents a program growth of approximately 206%.
- In June 2004, MDT implemented the Patriot Passport for honorably discharged veterans with incomes of \$22,000 or less. Currently, 4,146 Patriot Passports have been issued.

Public Works Department

• Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS): Following the completion of the alpha testing of the ATMS system, PWD has continued transferring signals onto the new system. Through 2006, PWD integrated 148 signals onto the ATMS. For 2007, PWD's goal is to add 100 signals per month. Every effort is being made to meet this goal; including the use of overtime by PWD staff. However, PWD has experienced difficulty in getting acceptable bids on electrical contracts which can affect the goals for this project. This is due in large part to the immense number of existing traffic signal contracts that have been executed by the Department. Through General Services Administration (GSA), PWD will be developing details to move the ATMS and the Traffic Signals and Signs Division into the new Lightspeed Building. (Partial funding for purchase of this building provided by the Surtax). PWD is in the process of acquiring a design firm to properly design the interior space for the new Traffic Control Center. Lastly, PWD is continuing to work with FDOT to share in the funding of the overall ATMS project. Their participation is critical to the success of this program.

- The PWD is working closely with each of the County Commissioner's offices to discuss prioritization of the Neighborhood Improvement Projects, such as resurfacing, sidewalks, drainage, striping, ADA sidewalks, guardrails, traffic signals, and school flashing signals.
- Since the inception, forty-six (46) PTP open construction contracts (totaling \$44.1 million) have been approved by the CITT and BCC. Each contract has been issued a Notice to Proceed.
- Multiple CICC contracts are also active for various PTP projects. In an effort to accelerate many neighborhood projects, PWD is taking advantage of various contracting mechanisms, such as the Miscellaneous Contracting processes available under CICC contracts 7360 and 7040.

PTP employees hired during the second guarter of FY06-07:

 During this quarter six (6) employees vacated PTP positions. No new PTP employees have been hired during this quarter, keeping the total at forty six (46)

PTP Municipal Component - Highlights of accomplishments

Municipal Initiatives:

City of Coral Gables

The following accomplishments were funded in total or in part by the PTP program:

- Fifteen (15) new curb "bump-outs" at existing trolley stops were constructed in the high density commercial area along the Coral Gables Trolley route (Ponce de Leon Boulevard) between Alcazar Avenue and Almeria Avenue. These trolley stop adjustments were constructed as part of the city's Ponce de Leon Boulevard Median Improvements Phase I Project and have resulted in an average roundtrip time gain of almost six (6) minutes travel time per trolley along the route.
- The city purchased four (4) new heavy-duty, low floor, diesel powered shuttle buses, with a
 vintage trolley configuration and passenger seating for 30 in the fall of 2006. Annual ridership
 on the Coral Gables Trolley grew by 29% over the previous year's figure. On Friday, March 2,
 2007, including riders for a special event, the Coral Gables Trolley recorded a record high oneday passenger count of 7,818 passengers.

City of Miami

The City of Miami is reporting the following transportation related projects currently being funded by the Surtax. These projects are under construction or have recently been completed as part of the city's 5-year Transportation Plan.

- The city is currently constructing the Fairlawn Storm Sewer Pump Station Project Phase IIA. It consists of road improvements such as roadway milling and resurfacing, damaged sidewalk replacement and ADA compliant ramps. This work is being done along with the construction of a new gravity conveyance system connected to a pump station at Antonio Maceo Park. Estimated cost of the project is \$1,976,077.00 with \$214,000.00 to be funded with Surtax proceeds.
- The city completed the *Miami River Greenway Streetscape Project Segment 2.* The project entailed the reconstruction of streets, including new sidewalks, road paving, new drainage, landscaping and street lighting based on the Greenway Master Plan. Estimated cost of the project is \$636,149.00 with \$261,837.00 funded with Surtax proceeds.
- The city is also in the process on constructing the "Silver Bluff Neighborhood Traffic Calming" project. The project includes traffic circles, medians, curbs, street paving, ADA compliant sidewalks, landscaping, signage and pavement marking as recommended by the traffic study conducted for that area. Estimated cost of the project is \$1,343,500.00 with \$1,240,000.00 to be funded with Surtax proceeds.
- The city completed the Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard project in collaboration with Miami-Dade County. Work included: milling and resurfacing, re-striping and replacement of substandard street signs, sidewalks and pedestrian ramps for NW 62nd Street from NW 37th Avenue to NW 5th Place. Estimated cost of the project is \$4,700,000.00 with \$300,000.00 funded with Surtax proceeds.

City of Hialeah

 Utilizing Surtax funds as a match, the City of Hialeah received an MPO grant and State of Florida monies to increase and upgrade its transit fleet. The city will be replacing its current bus fleet next year and increasing the Flamingo route from 4 to 5 buses. In total the city will operate 9 buses on two routes (Flamingo and Marlin).

Village of Pinecrest

Utilizing Surtax funds as a match, the village received an MPO grant for \$30,000.00 to conduct
a study to investigate operational and safety needs and improvement alternatives for 11
intersections along US-1.

Village of Palmetto Bay and Miami Shores Village

• The villages of Palmetto Bay and Miami Shores have commenced circulator bus service for the citizens of their respective areas.

Town of Miami Lakes

 The Town of Miami Lakes launched its new "Lunch Express" shuttle route to alleviate traffic congestion during the mid-day. The circulator service is available from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

City of South Miami

- South Miami Trolley Service Study A public workshop was held on Wednesday, January 17, 2007 at the City Commission Chamber to receive residents' input to assist in the planning stages of the study. The study is designed to determine the service area and routes for the proposed shuttle service.
- Citywide Drainage Improvements Phase 3 The city is addressing drainage problems at SW 62nd Terrace from SW 60th Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue; SW 63rd Street from SW 60th Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue; and SW 63rd Terrace from SW 60th Avenue to SW 62nd Avenue. Investigation has determined that the drainage system in the area is substandard and that redevelopment in the area may have created additional draining into the street. In order to correct the flooding issues, it is imperative that a new exfiltration trench system be installed.
- Sunset Drive Improvements This project is in accordance with the Hometown Plan Area 2 and involves improvements from the western city limits to SW 62nd Avenue. The proposed improvements include landscaping, sidewalks, curbs, drainage, median construction irrigation, paving, street furniture, lighting, signage, pavement, and marking and sighting. Public hearings were held in August and October of 2006. Currently the consultant selected is engaged in working on the final design of the project.
- Staff attended the Village of Pinecrest Council meeting of January 16, 2007 in order to discuss
 the village's utilization of Surtax funds to acquire land for a park and ride lot. The CITT
 Executive Director made a presentation before the Village Council on the appropriate uses of
 PTP municipal funds. Prior to the meeting date, staff met with the Village Manager regarding
 concerns raised by residents of the village in reference to the proposed park and ride lot.
- Staff forwarded letters to the cities and to the Miami Dade County League of Cities informing them of the proposed changes to the current Interlocal Agreement between Miami-Dade County and the local municipalities eligible to receive the Charter County Transit System Sales Surtax Funds.

CITT Updates

- The CITT continues to meet regularly to ensure that it is fulfilling its responsibility to "monitor, oversee, review, audit and investigate" the implementation of the PTP. The Trust met four (4) times during the guarter. A guorum was present at all CITT meetings.
- CITT Committees met on a regular basis during the quarter and, as per their respective subject areas, reviewed items to be forwarded to the full CITT for its consideration. Five (5) CITT Committee meetings took place during the quarter.
- During the quarter, the CITT passed 25 resolutions relating to the consideration of PWD, MDT and OCITT contracts in support of the People's Transportation Plan.

- The CITT passed three (3) resolutions recommending amending the People's Transportation Plan.
- The Office of the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (OCITT) continued to follow-up on a letter forwarded to the municipalities requesting that they answer an attached questionnaire /spreadsheet designed to review Charter County Transit System Surtax expenditures. In order to ensure that the Surtax funds are being utilized appropriately and as part of the responsibilities under County Ordinance 02-116 and the Interlocal Agreement with the cities, the OCITT is requesting that all municipalities that receive surtax proceeds respond to the inquiry.

Office of the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (OCITT)

- The Executive Director is a part of the planning committee for the Conference on Minority Transportation Officials (COMTO) and is Chairperson of the Finance and Budget Committee for the 2007 meeting that will be held in Miami on June 22, 2007. In this capacity, the Executive Director attended two meetings this quarter.
- CITT will have a booth in the COMTO exhibit area featuring information on the Trust.

Website Updates:

30 website updates, revisions, and postings were made during this quarter

Community Outreach:

CITT Members and OCITT staff participated in a total of 16 community outreach events highlighting CITT's role in ensuring proper expenditure of transportation surtax proceeds and implementation of PTP projects:

- CITT Chairperson Miles E. Moss, P.E. made a presentation to the Rotary Club of Coconut Grove discussing CITT activities, the PTP, and responding to questions and comments from the public.
- OCITT staff made comprehensive presentations to two (2) Team Metro Citizens' Academy sessions speaking to participants about CITT and its role in monitoring surtax expenditures.
- OCITT staff participated in three (3) Chamber South Transportation Committee meetings reporting on CITT activities, the municipal program and the status of other PTP projects.
- The department published and distributed the CITT newsletter, "CITT Insider" and submitted a CITT news article for publication in the Florida Public Transportation Association newsletter.

Compliance and Oversight:

- The committee will continue to monitor and report the status of County contracts pertaining to opportunities generated by the People's Transportation Plan.
- The Department of Business Development (DBD) will be requested to attend bi-monthly meetings.
- Miami-Dade Transit monitors the status of Surtax funded contracts that include federal funding.
 To date, MDT reports 11 Prime Contractors and 48 Subcontractors that are subjected to
 Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) compliance measures

Finance

During the quarter, the OCITT received \$51,776,409 in surtax proceeds, and transferred \$10,360,696 to eligible municipalities as part of the established municipal share.
