Decisions of the Community Zoning Appeals Board (CZAB) may be subject to appeal or other challenge. For example, depending upon the nature of the requests and applications addressed by the CZAB, a CZAB decision may be directly appealable to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) or may be subject to challenge in Circuit Court. Challenges asserted in Circuit Court, where available, must ordinarily be filed within 30 days of the transmittal of the pertinent CZAB resolution to the Clerk of the BCC. Appeals to the BCC, where available, must be filed with the Zoning Hearing Section of the Department of Planning and Zoning (DPZ) within 14 days after the DPZ has posted a short, concise statement (such as that furnished above for the listed items) that sets forth the action that was taken by the CZAB. (The DPZ's posting will be made on a bulletin board located in the office of the DPZ.) All

other applicable requirements imposed by rule, ordinance, or other law must also be observed when filing or otherwise pursuing any challenge to a CZAB decision.
