SW 152nd Avenue from SW 81st Lane to SW 72nd Street

This sidewalk improvement project consists of, but is not limited to, removal and replacement of damaged existing concrete sidewalk, construction of new concrete sidewalk, modification of existing or construction of new pedestrian access ramps to comply with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, construction of curb and gutter, construction of connectors and landings at bus stops, and modification/restoration of driveways.

Construction Schedule: Construction is scheduled to begin on June 25th, 2013 and anticipated to be completed in July, 2013 (weather permitting).

Total Cost: \$16,112.80

Legislative Highlights

On the Agenda for July 2, 2013 Board of County Commissioners Meeting.

- Resolution urging the Florida cabinet sitting as the Electrical Power Plant and the Transmission Line Siting Board to reject all proposals to the East of the Urban Expansion Area for the Florida Power and Light Company's proposed Western Transmission Line Corridor. Transmission line proposals to the east of the Urban Expansion Area could bring the required high voltage transmission lines within a few hundred feet of residential neighborhoods and commercial development. The placement of transmission lines near residential areas may have an adverse aesthetic impact, may detract from the areas' natural beauty, and may affect individuals' enjoyment of parks, outdoor shopping, and other outdoor activities. Accepting a transmission line proposal to the west of the Urban Expansion Area would result in the final transmission line route being farther away from existing residential or commercial development. - Ordinance mandating that taxicabs that transport persons and their baggage from Miami International Airport and Port of Miami be equipped with credit card processing systems within specified time period; establishing requirements relating to credit card processing systems and providers; empowering department of regulatory and economic resources to approve credit card processing systems; requiring County Commission to amend taxicab fares to include discount for payment by cash, check or other means not involving the use of a credit card within specified time period; amending Chapter 8CC of the code to provide for penalties; providing severability, inclusion in the code, and an effective date.

- Ordinance establishing the Public Private Partnership Program of Miami-Dade County. Infrastructure is a vital and foundational element in the future of Miami-Dade County and the County's infrastructure including its mass transit facilities, airport and seaport, fuel supply facilities, medical or nursing care facilities, recreational facilities, sporting facilities and water and waste water facilities require significant and on-going improvements and upgrades. With a growing need to replace our community's aging infrastructure, and with diminishing State and Federal grant monies available to fund municipal projects, we need to move forward with public-private partnerships to find innovative ways to finance major capital projects without raising the tax burden on our property owners.

Home Energy Assistance Program Now Available to Assist Low Income Residents

Low-income individuals can receive assistance with their utility costs through the Community Action and Human Services Department Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) beginning on Monday, April 1, 2013. To qualify, applicants must not exceed 150% of the U.S. Poverty Income Guidelines. Qualified applicants facing a crisis situation may be eligible to receive up to a \$600 payment toward their outstanding electric or gas bills. Regular energy applications may receive between \$150-\$300 dollar payment applied to their utility bill.
