Home Chemical Collection Tips

Use it up!	Store it carefully!
◆ Use products up before purchasing new products.	◆ Store hazardous products out of reach of children in a locked cupboard or high shelf.
◆ Purchase amounts that can be used up easily.	◆ Store in a dry place, and keep from freezing.
◆ Read and follow label safety directions.	◆ Store away from heat or flames.
◆ Do not use pesticides that are more than 10 years old, as they may be banned.	◆ Keep original label intact, and store in original container.
◆ If you can't use it up, bring it to us for proper disposal.	◆ Do not mix products together.
