

Appliance Recycling Rebate Program Fact Sheet

This fact sheet outlines the Miami-Dade Department of Solid Waste Management's **limited** role in the State of Florida's Appliance Recycling Rebate Program.

- In addition to the rebate offered on the purchase of energy-efficient appliances, the State is offering a \$75 rebate to consumers who “provide evidence of having recycled the old appliance” that was replaced by the purchase of the new rebate-qualifying appliance. “That evidence may consist of a statement on the retailer receipt indicating pick-up of the old appliance or a receipt from the local public or private landfill of delivery of the old appliance.”
- To accommodate consumers in Miami-Dade County who wish to receive the additional \$75 appliance recycling rebate, the Miami-Dade Department of Solid Waste Management (DSWM) has instituted the following procedures during the rebate period of April 16, 2010 through April 25, 2010.
 - Residents should **NOT** take old appliances to a DSWM landfill.
 - DSWM will instead accept old appliances at the following Trash and Recycling Centers (TRC) that accept “white goods” (old appliances):
 - Eureka Drive, 9401 SW 184 Street
 - Golden Glades, 140 NW 160 Street
 - Moody Drive, 12970 SW 268 Street
 - North Dade, 21500 NW 47 Avenue
 - Norwood, 19901 NW 7 Avenue
 - Palm Springs North, 7870 NW 178 Street
 - South Miami Heights, 20800 SW 117 Court
 - Sunset Kendall, 8000 SW 107 Avenue
 - West Little River, 1830 NW 79 Street
 - West Perrine, 16651 SW 107 Ave

- Residents will receive a separate receipt for each eligible appliance delivered to the TRC. The receipt can be used to apply for the State's \$75 appliance recycling rebate. **Please note that the DSWM will only issue receipts for appliance recycling drop off. The DSWM is not responsible for issuing the \$75 rebate.**
 - Receipts will only be provided for the types of appliances listed below:
 - Water heaters
 - Clothes washers
 - Refrigerators
 - Dishwashers
 - Room/wall unit air-conditioners
 - Freezers
 - THE FOLLOWING TWO ITEMS ARE EXTREMELY IMPORTANT:
 1. Before residents bring their old appliances to a TRC, they should write down the vital information from their appliance (see following list) so they can complete the receipt DSWM will give them; DSWM employees will **NOT** be able to recover information from appliances at the TRC.
 - Appliance type (refrigerator, washing machine, etc.)
 - Model
 - Manufacturer
 - Serial Number
 2. Normally, only residents served by DSWM are allowed to use the TRCs.
 - During the dates of the rebate program (April 16 through April 25), DSWM will make an exception and allow all Miami-Dade residents to bring ONLY old appliances to participating TRCs for the appliance receipt.
