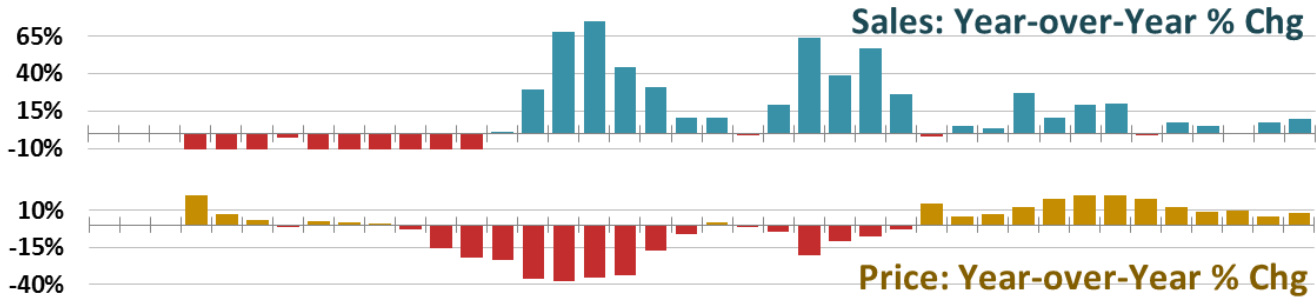
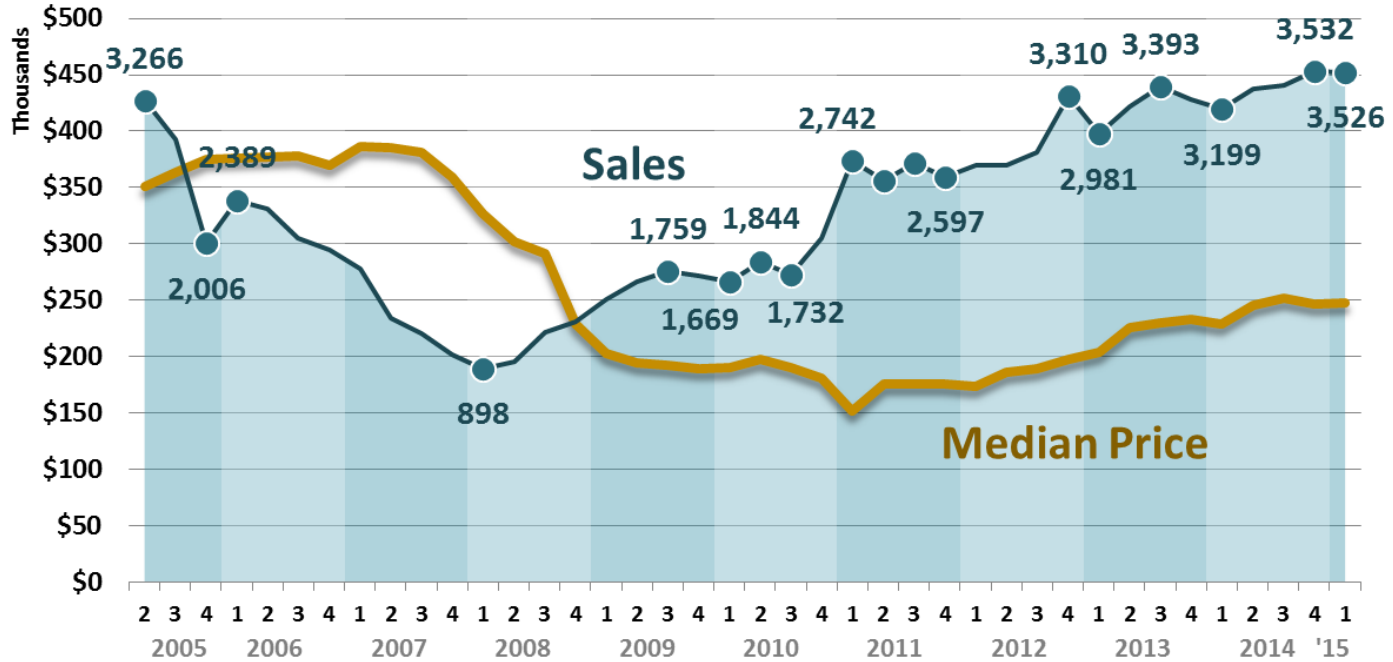
Quick Demographic Overview

- MDC '14 Population: **2,662,874** (10yr **CAGR 1.4%**).
- Hispanics, **1.7M (66%)**; Black NH, **441K (17%)**; White NH, **393K (15%)**
- Foreign Born Population: **1.4M (52%; CAGR 1.6%; 93% born in Latin America)**
 - FB Naturalized Citizens: **741K , 55% of FB**
- Median age 2013: **39.0** vs. **36.6** in 2004.
 - Share < 5 years, **5.9%** vs. **7.2%** in 2004
 - Share > 64 years, **14.9%** vs **13.4%** in 2004

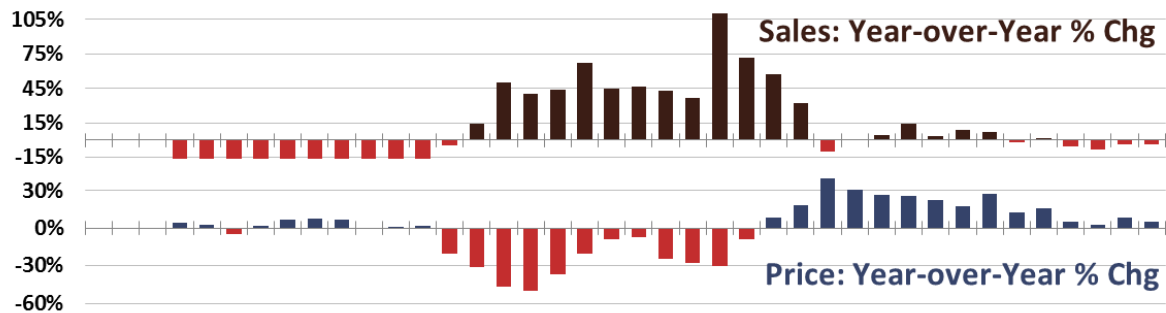
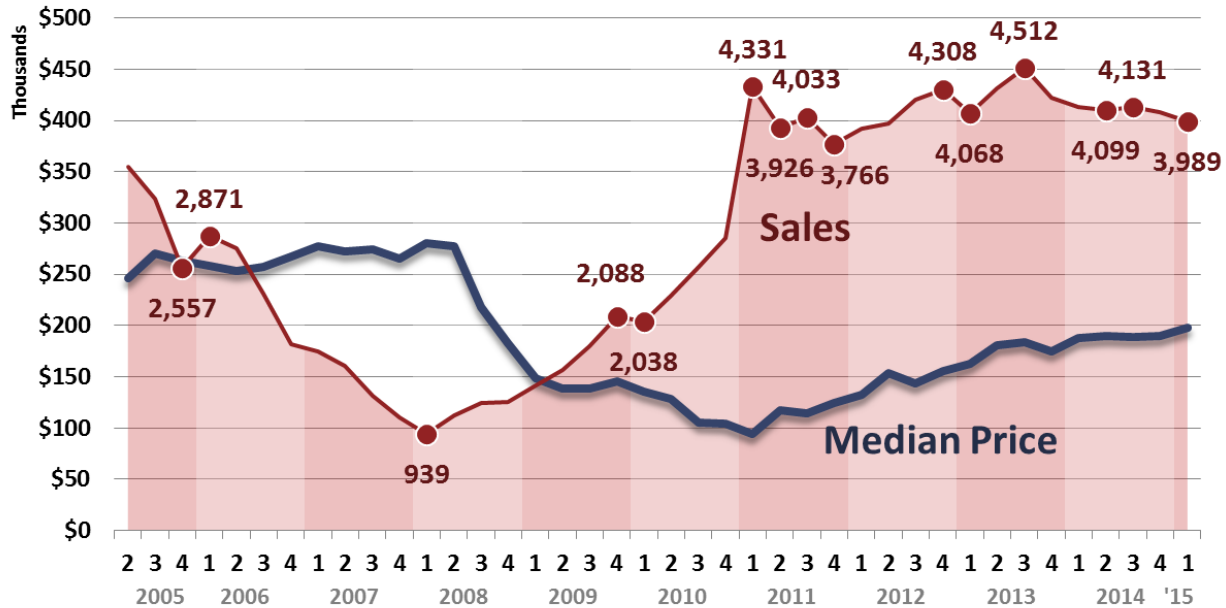

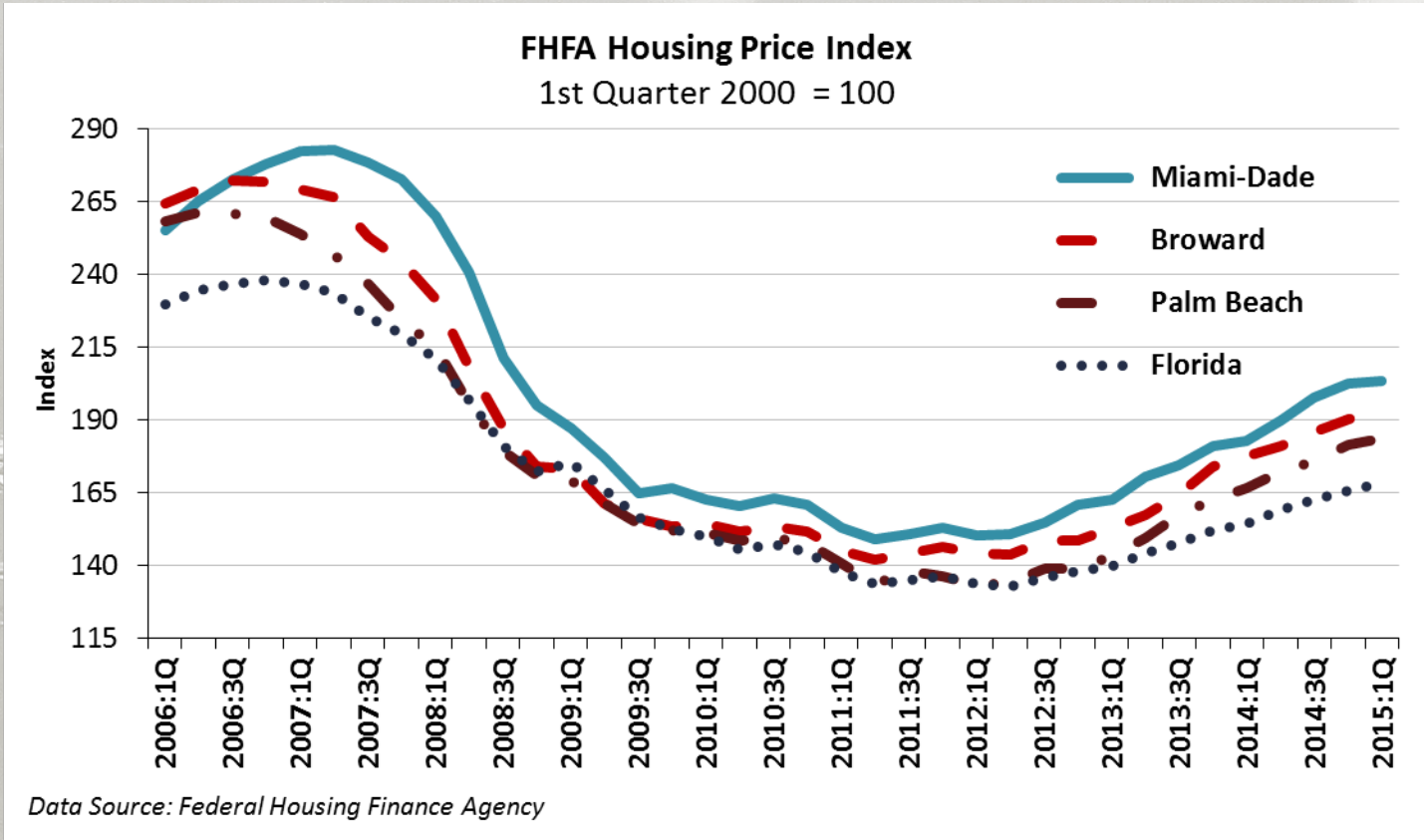
Single Family Home Market Median Price & Seasonally Adj. Sales



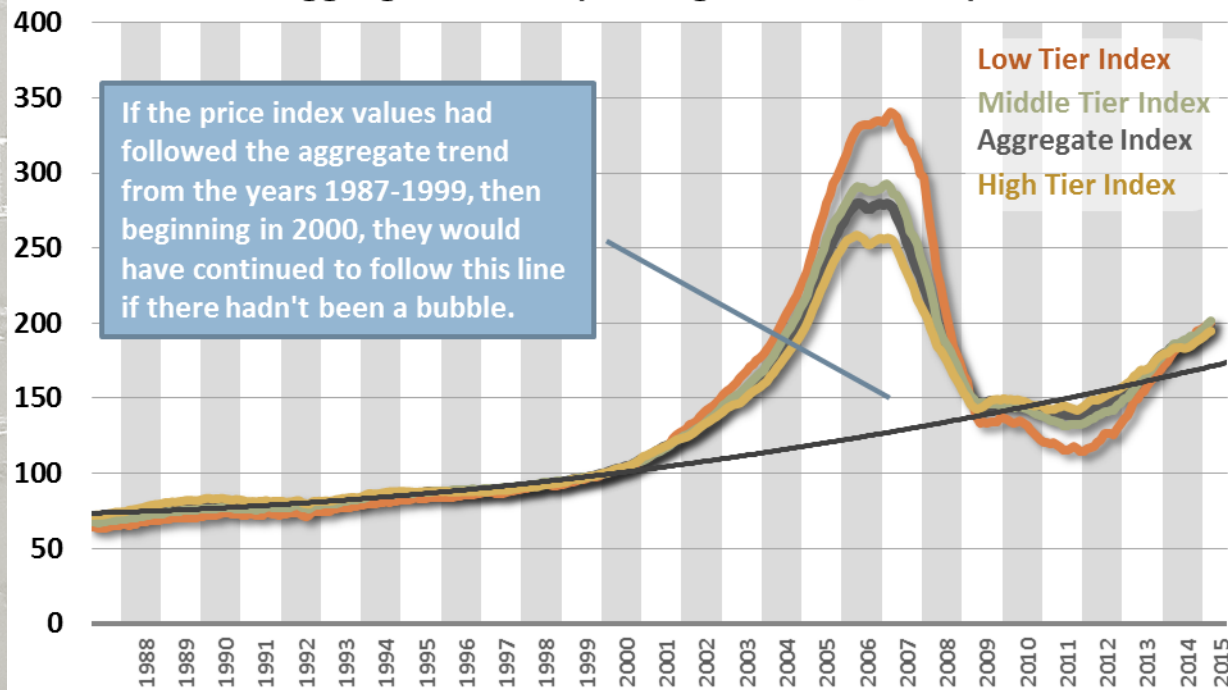
Condominium Market

Median Price & Seasonally Adj. Sales





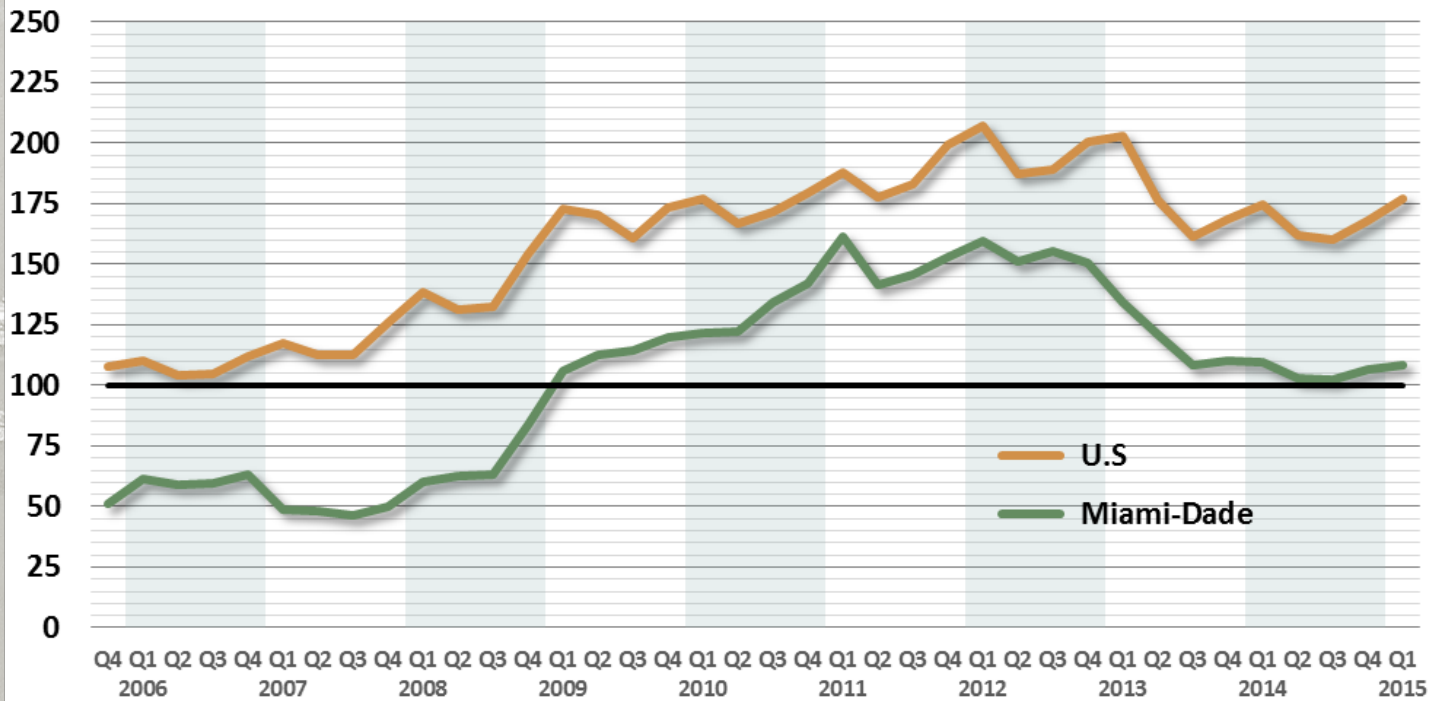
Case-Shiller Index - Deviation from the Long Term Trend* of Aggregate Index (Through March, 2015)

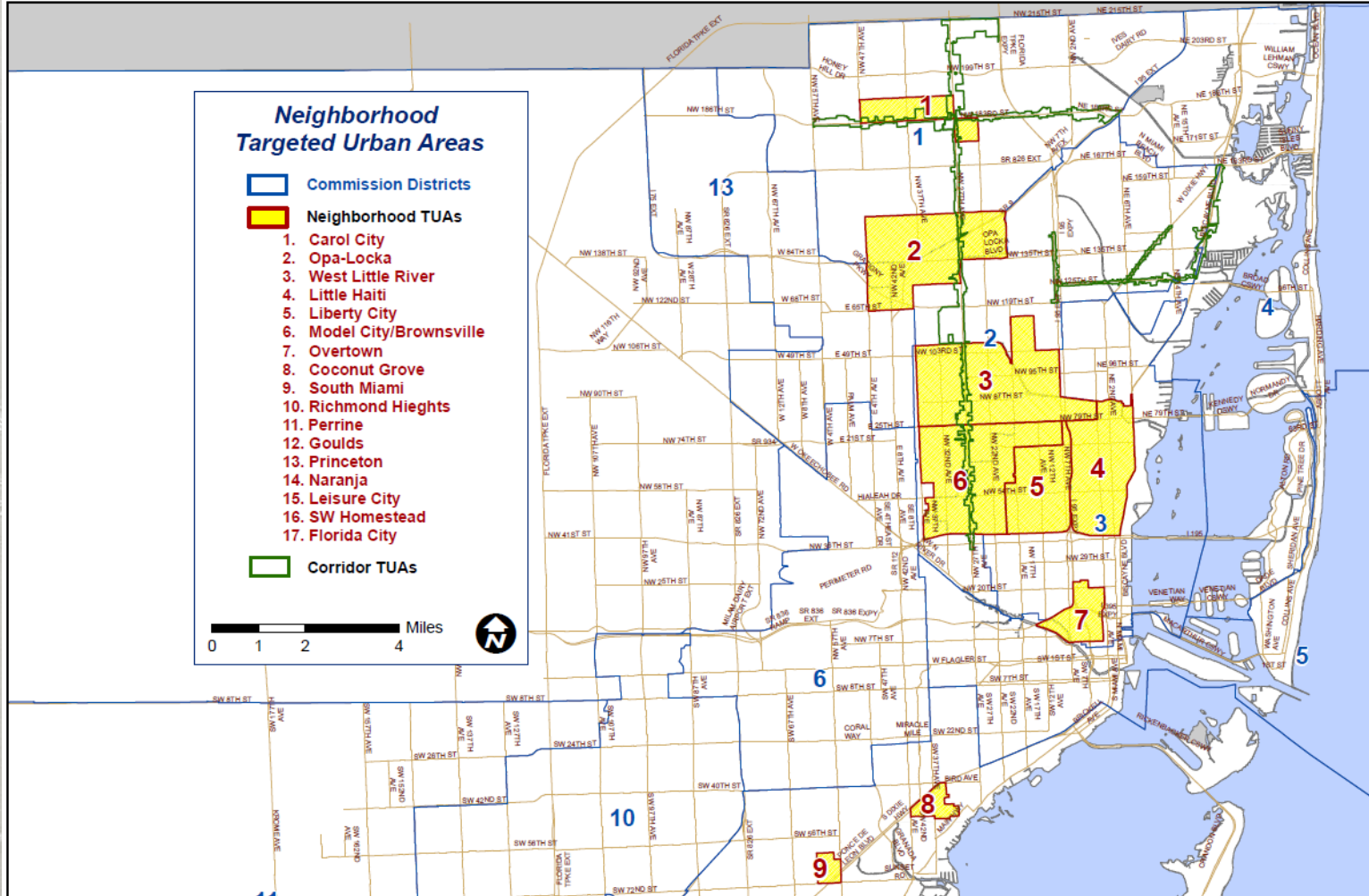

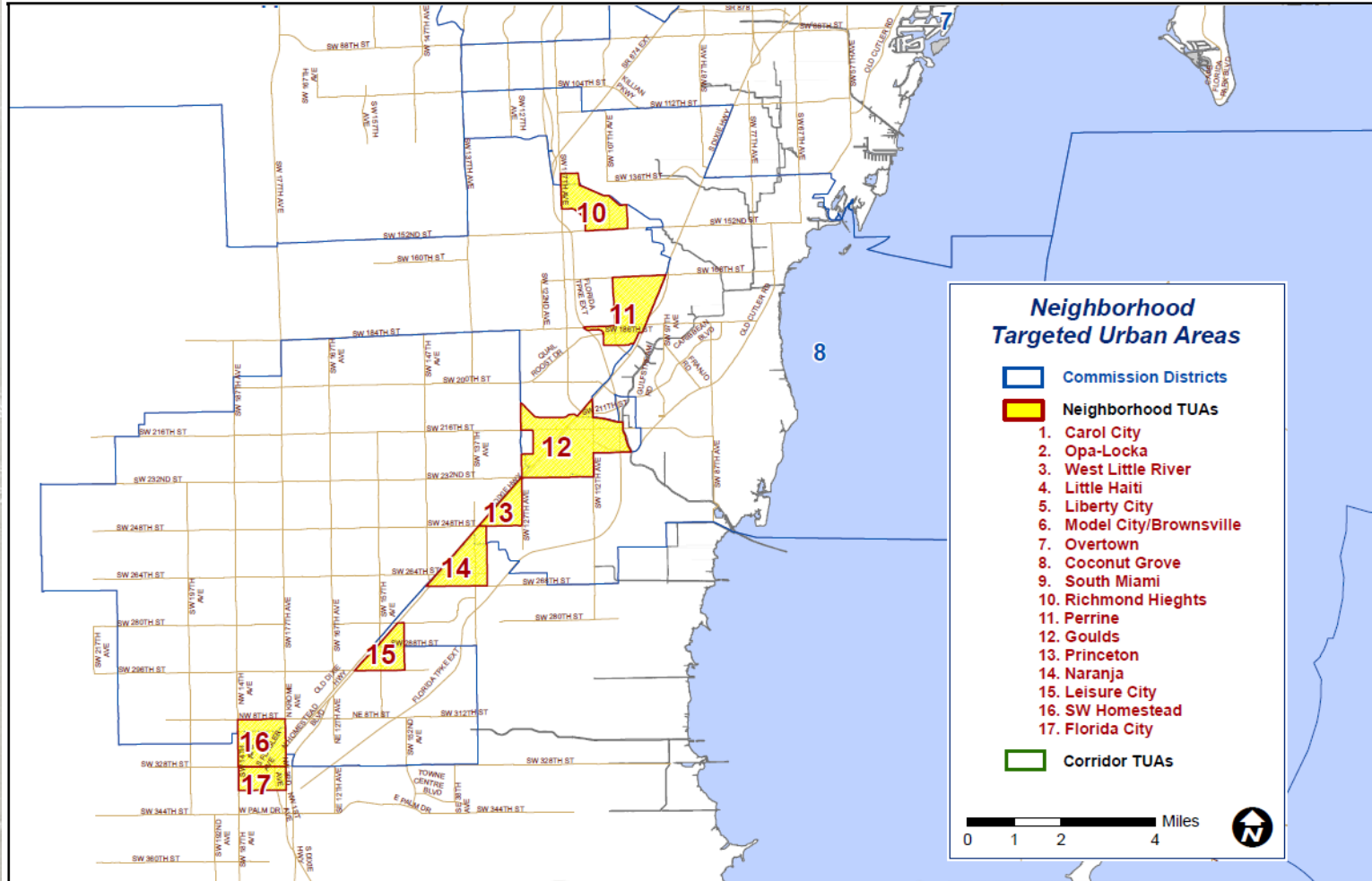

Illustration: Model City/ Brownsville TUA

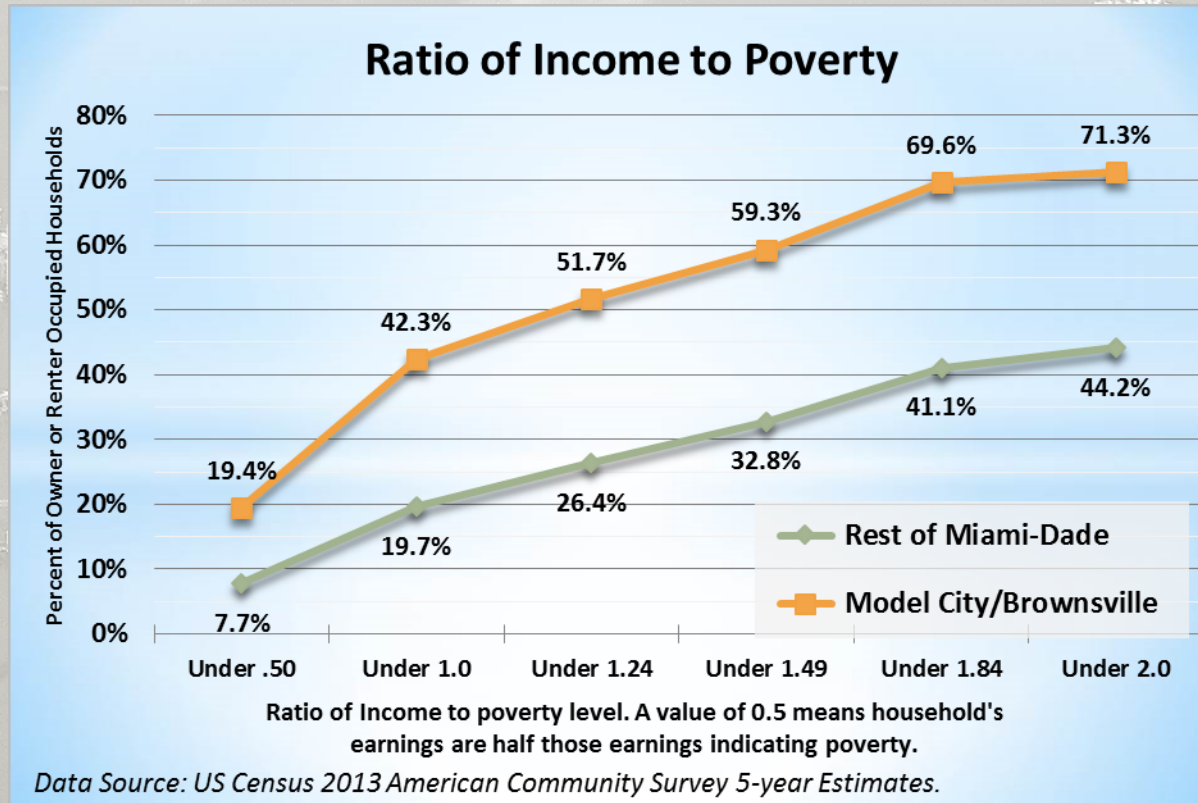


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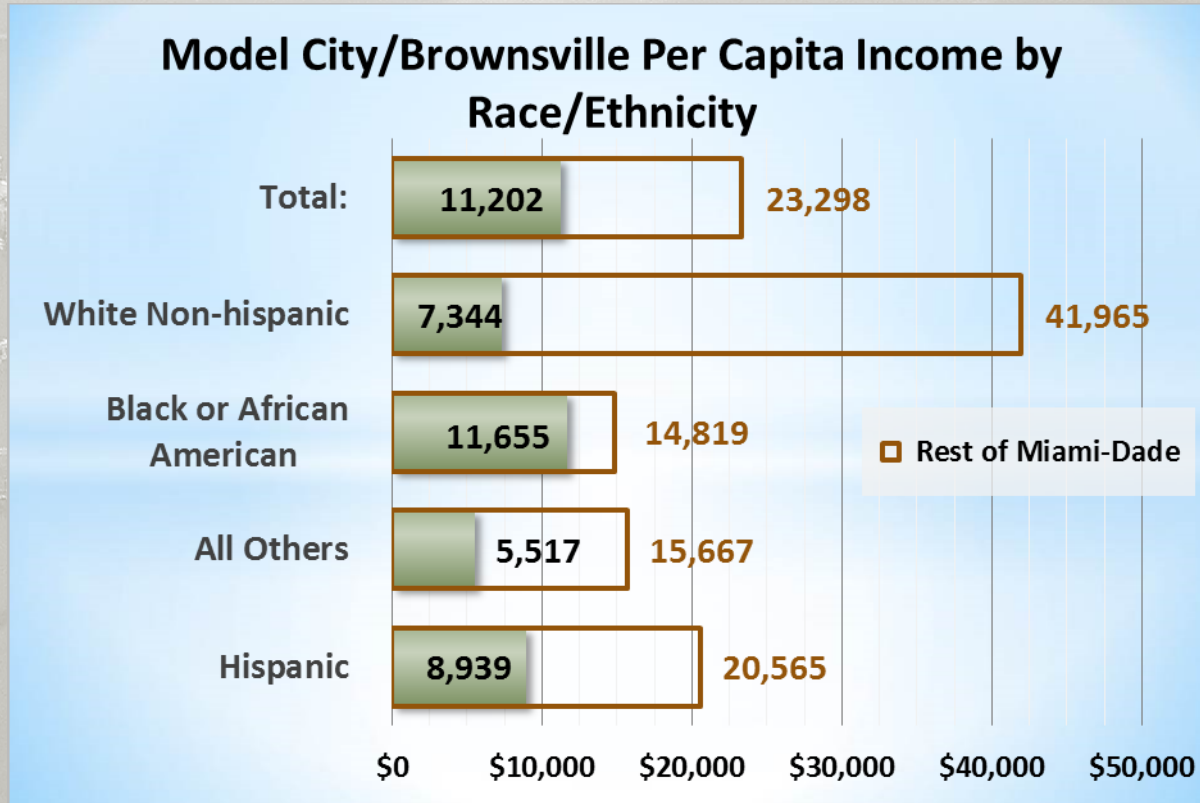


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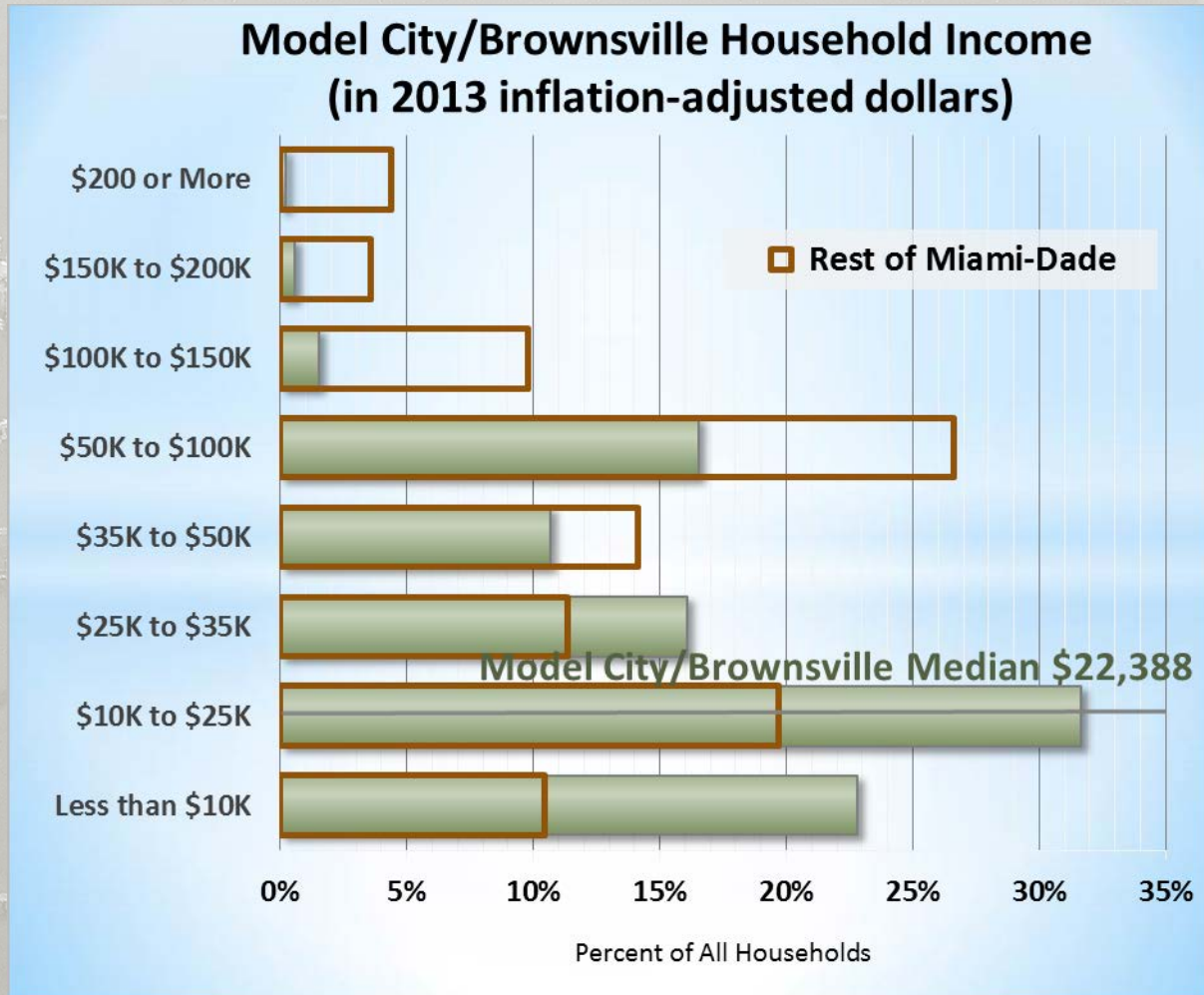


Illustration: Model City/ Brownsville TUA

Home Values in Model City/Brownsville

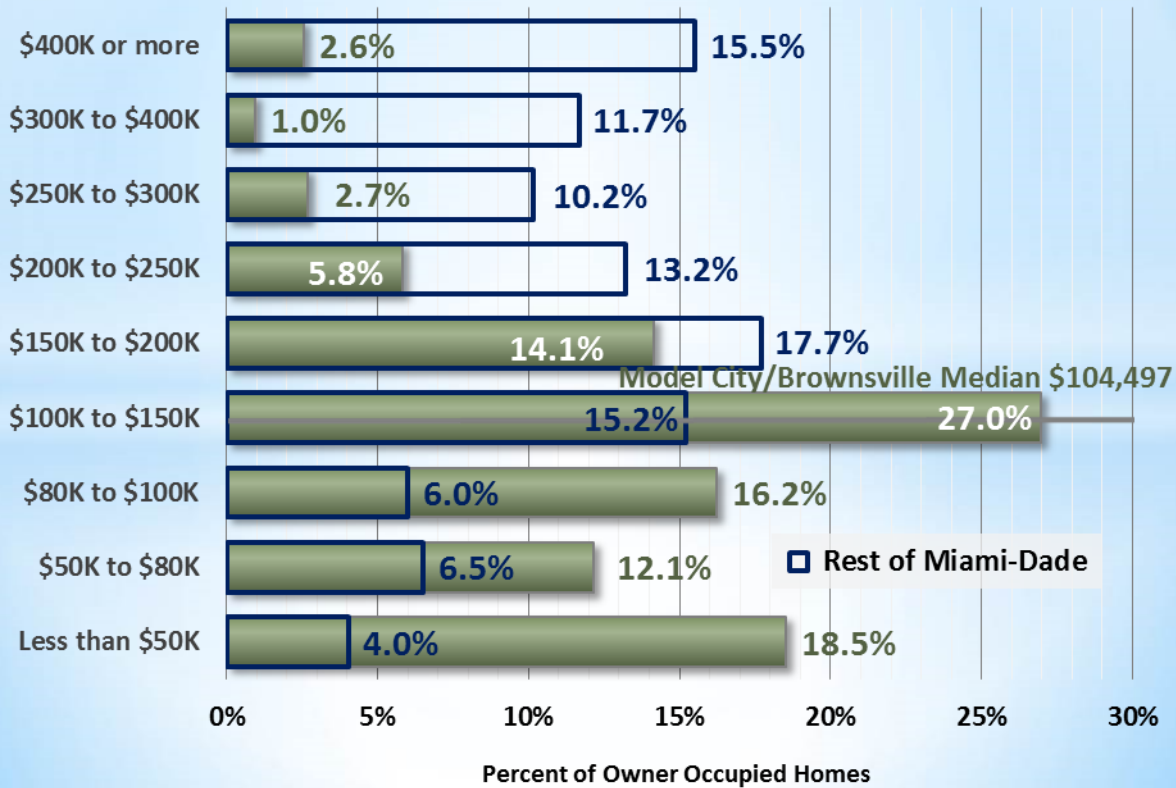
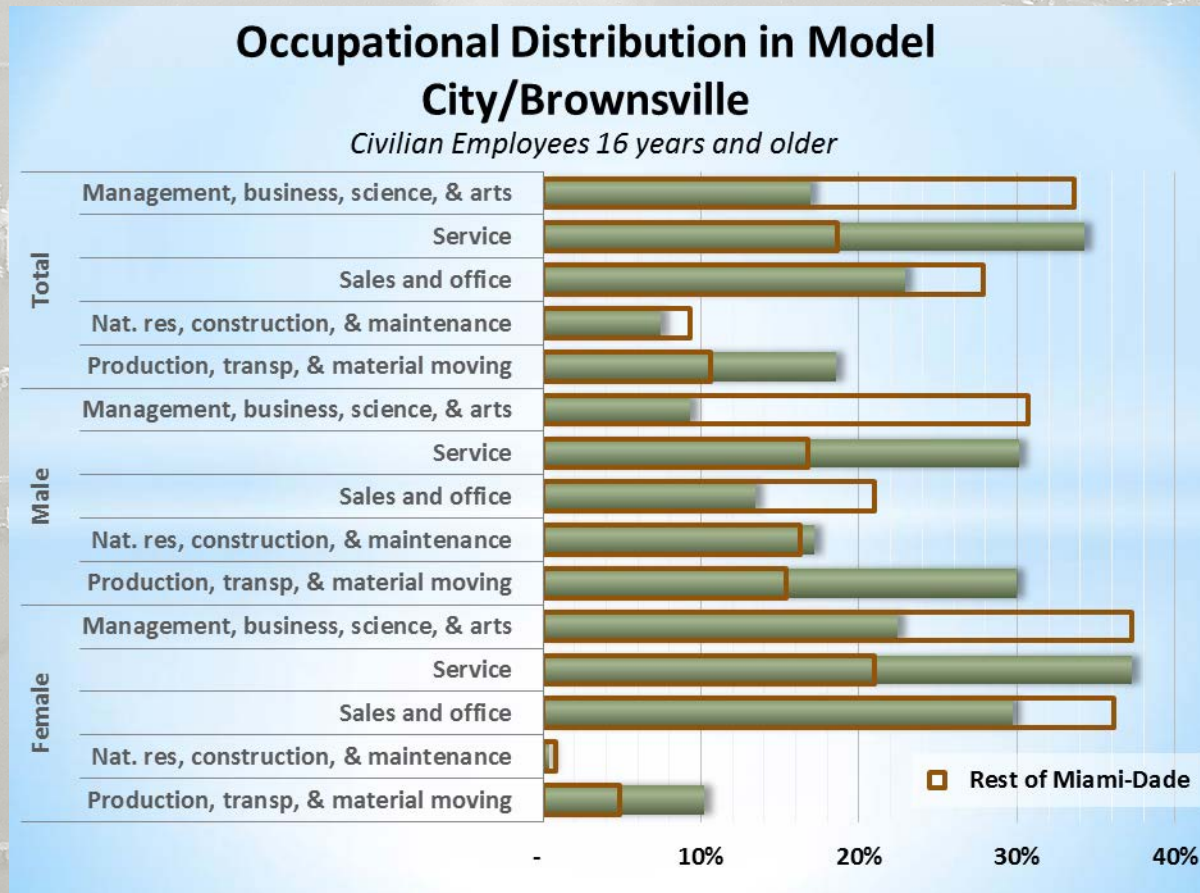
