00- 125	10/13/00	Campaign Financing/Reporting of contributions to candidates through intermediaries and conduits; providing for Electronic Reporting and Posting of Independent Expenditures; requires each person making independent expenditure for covered County candidates to file required Campaign Treasurer Reports on diskettes or CD-ROMs simultaneously with and in addition to original signed report. Reports must be delivered to Elections Department on or before due date. Requires that Reports be posted on Elections Website within 3 business days of receipt except for reports due 4 days prior to an election, which shall be posted within 2 days. Requires report regarding aggregate contributions equal to or greater than \$5,000 within 14 days of election be filed within 2 business days of receipt by the candidate each time candidate receives aggregate contributions equal to or greater than \$5,000. 98-94	07/17/98	Ethical Campaign Practices/Providing for Mandatory and Voluntary Fair Campaign Practices Councils candidates and their respective campaign staffs. Candidates for applicable offices are automatically covered by the Ordinance. Candidates for applicable offices must abide by mandatory fair campaign practices and may agree to abide by voluntary campaign practices. Other candidates may agree to abide by Fair Campaign Practices including their respective campaign staffs for any municipal elective office within Miami-Dade County; and any candidate and his or her campaign staff for elective office with a constituency in whole or in part in Miami-Dade County. Provides for agreement to abide by Statement of Fair Campaign Practices; provides penalties; empowers enforcement by Ethics Commission. Ordinance relating to.
