ORDER GRANTING EMERGENCY INJUNCTION

This matter, having come before the Court on Plaintiff's Emergency Motion for Temporary Injunctive Relief, and the Court, having heard the argument and reviewed the file, including the evidentiary submissions, and otherwise being fully advised in the premises, and having found that there is no adequate remedy at law, that there is a likelihood of irreparable harm if injunctive relief is not granted, that Plaintiff has a clear legal right to the relief sought and a substantial likelihood of success on the merits, and that considerations of the public interest and public policy dictate the issuance of temporary injunctive relief, it is hereby:


ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

1. Plaintiff's Emergency Motion for Temporary Injunctive Relief is GRANTED.
2. Defendant, and her officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys and all persons in active concert with them, shall take such steps as are necessary to extend the early voting period at the Lemon City Branch Library early voting site for two (2) hours, through **9:00 p.m.** on Sunday, November 6, 2016;
3. Defendant, and her officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys and all persons in active concert with them, shall provide public notice of the extended early voting period at the Lemon City Branch Library location, by *immediately*:

- (a) notifying local media, including (i) local television stations, including ABC, CBS, NBC, PBS, Fox, Telemundo, Univision; (ii) newspapers, including the Miami Herald, South Florida Times, Le Floridian, and Le National, and (iii) major local radio stations that serve the local community, including HOT 105, 99 Jamz, and 103.5 The Beat;
- (b) posting a public notice of the extension prominently on the home page of the Elections Department's website;
- (c) posting a prominent notice at the entrance to the Lemon City Branch Library that early voting hours have been extended by Court order until 9:00 p.m., plus a copy of this Order;
- (d) responding to any voter inquiries received before 9:00 p.m. today that they have the right to vote at the Lemon City Branch Library.

4. The Court finds that under the circumstances presented here, Plaintiff need not post a bond pursuant to Rule 1.610(b), Fla. R. Civ. P., because the injunctive relief sought by Plaintiff, and awarded by this Court, is designed to avoid abuse and to protect and preserve the Constitutional and statutory voting rights of Miami-Dade County citizens.
