




Workforce Solutions Education Partner Grant Program

Connecting Working Learners with Affordable Education

University of Phoenix recognizes the significant investment your organization makes to education and training, and is committed to help you make higher education more affordable for your employees. University of Phoenix has developed the Workforce Solutions Education Partner Grant program, designed to provide eligible students with substantial tuition reductions - as much as an additional \$3,000 for a Bachelor's degree - on top of the corporate tuition reduction your employees may already receive from the University. The Workforce Solutions Education Partner Grant program is one of many University initiatives designed to connect working learners with the resources they need to achieve their personal and professional aspirations.



Eligibility

The Workforce Solutions Education Partner Grant program is only available to newly enrolling students.

To participate, students must:

- Be employed by a Workforce Solutions education partner.
- Enroll and attend a class between April 12, 2013 and September 30, 2013 in an Associate, Bachelor's, or Master's degree program.
- Sign a Memorandum of Understanding acknowledging the eligibility requirements and benefits of the program.

Benefits

Eligible students will receive a credit against tuition per the table shown below for all credit-bearing University courses started between April 12, 2013 and August 31, 2014. This Grant is provided in addition to the tuition reduction which may already be in place between your organization and University of Phoenix. After August 31, 2014, the Grant benefit will end, at which time the regular corporate tuition reduction (if applicable) will be applied.

The Benefits shown above are based on a student maintaining continuous enrollment for a year in a School of Business program at the University's Online campus per the University's July 1, 2012 tuition rates. A student who attends without breaks can take up to ten Associate level classes, ten Bachelor's level classes, or eight Master's level classes in a year. Students who are enrolled in a different program, at a local ground campus, or who take breaks between classes may receive a lesser Grant benefit. Benefits will vary if the University changes its tuition rates during the course eligibility period.
