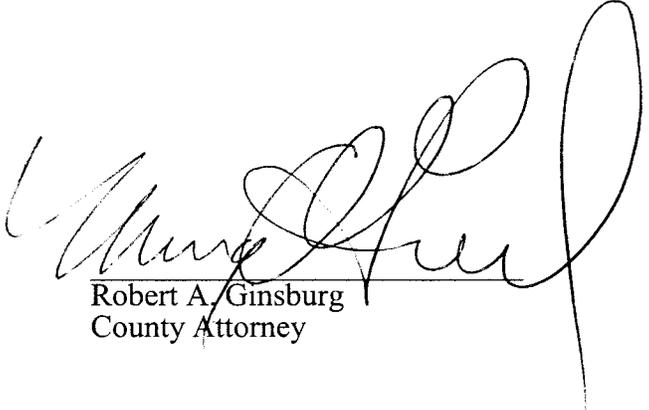

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO
APPLY FOR GRANTS AND OTHER FUNDING FOR UNMET
CAPITAL NEEDS AT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES AND TO
REPORT TO THE BOARD

WHEREAS, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation has identified several unfunded capital needs, including the replacement of retherm (food reheating) units, renovation of the medical clinic at the PTDC (main jail), architectural and engineering design services for certification at the PTDC, refurbish freezer and cooler at PTDC and TGK, implement a video visiting pilot project, and upgrading of laundry facilities at TTC; and

WHEREAS, the County is taking steps to secure a long-term source of funding for the capital needs of the Department of Corrections through the preparation of a proposal for general obligation bonds to be submitted for voter approval in 2004; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for an interim source of funding for the most critical of these unmet capital needs; and

WHEREAS, there are several potential sources of grants and other funding, including the United States Department of Justice and the United States Marshal's Service,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Manager to have staff research and apply for available grants and other sources of funding for repairs and other unmet capital needs at the various correctional facilities of the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. The Manager shall report to the Board on the

status of such funding requests at the first meeting of the Board of County Commissioners after the summer vacation recess in August.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Dorrin D. Rolle and offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
