On July 8, 2003, a ballot was presented to the Board of County Commissioners for the appointment of a replacement member to the IRP; however, on this date a majority of the County Commission did not cast a vote. The result of that ballot was as follows:

In accordance with Section 2-11.43 of the Miami-Dade County Code, the attached ballot is presented for appointment of a replacement member to the IRP.
