RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO  
DESIGNATE A PORTION OF N.W. 103<sup>rd</sup> STREET IN HONOR  
OF SENATOR WILLIAM H. TURNER

**WHEREAS**, Senator William H. "Bill" Turner died on November 1, 2002 at age 71 after more than four decades of public service to the people of Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Turner made significant contributions to our community particularly in the areas of children and education over the course of his public service; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Turner worked as an elementary school teacher for 14 years from 1956 to 1970; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Turner served on the Miami-Dade School Board for 18 years from 1970 to 1978 and from 1982 to 1992; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami-Dade County School Board voted in 1992 to name a vocational high school after Senator Turner who was then the School Board's only African-American member, the William H. Turner Technical Arts School; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Turner took an active role in the vocational school named in his honor; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Turner served in the Florida Senate from 1992 to 1998 where he was a strong advocate for children and education initiatives; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of Senator Turner's contributions to the people of Miami-Dade County, a street should be named in his honor,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to designate N.W. 103<sup>rd</sup> Street from N.W. 3rd Avenue to N.W. 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue in honor of Senator William H. Turner.

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board is directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and the Chair and members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. The Office of Intergovernmental Affairs is directed to include this item in the 2004 state legislative package.
