RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MANAGER'S ACTION IN APPLYING FOR STATE FUNDS FROM THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM; AND AUTHORIZING THE DESIGNATION OF THE DADE-MIAMI CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL AS THE REQUIRED ADVISORY BOARD FOR PURPOSES OF THE GRANT; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO RECEIVE, EXPEND, AND EXECUTE CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS AND NECESSARY AMENDMENTS TO THE APPLICATION

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves the County Manager's action in applying for federal funds from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, in the amount of \$974,181, for the implementation of the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, approves the designation of the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council as the Advisory Board for the purposes of the grant; to execute such applications, contracts and agreements as required, following their approval by the County Attorney's Office; to receive, disburse, and expend any and all monies received for the purposes and as described in the application; to receive, disburse, and expend additional funds should they become available; and to file and execute any necessary amendments to the application, contracts and agreements for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The Miami-Dade Police Department recommends the following allocation of the ninth year of LLEBG monies:

SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE OVERTIME **\$1,082,423**

District Enhanced Enforcement Activities:

The district enhanced enforcement activities allow for the effectuation of a myriad of crime reduction and crime prevention strategies. District enhanced enforcement efforts are developed to address the specific needs of each district, and often utilize COMPSTAT, an in-depth statistical review of criminal activities, to identify and address emerging crime trends. Weekly COMPSTAT meetings are held to discuss trends and plan proactive, aggressive operations to address criminal activity.

District enhanced enforcement efforts can include, but are not limited to, commercial and residential burglary surveillance operations, roadside and parking lot robbery deterrence, juvenile curfew enforcement, truancy sweeps, vehicle burglary details, traffic and DUI enforcement, gang sweep activities, prostitution details, underage drinking details, narcotics enforcement, drag racing enforcement, VIN etching projects, and investigations of pawn shops. These activities will be conducted throughout the fiscal year to address the varying needs of the communities in unincorporated Miami-Dade County. During previous fiscal years, these efforts have resulted in significant felony, misdemeanor, traffic, warrant, and DUI arrests as well as firearms seizures, curfew violations issued, and truants returned to school. It is anticipated similar results will be effectuated with the ability to maintain these proactive crime-fighting efforts.
