

RESOLUTION APPROVING REDEVELOPMENT OF CRANDON BOULEVARD WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF KEY BISCAZYNE, SUBSTANTIALLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CRANDON BOULEVARD MASTER PLAN APPROVED FEBRUARY 24, 2004 BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF KEY BISCAZYNE

WHEREAS, this Board by Resolution No. R-70-02 approved an Interlocal Agreement with the Village of Key Biscayne, providing for up to \$50,000 to help fund a Comprehensive Streetscape Master Plan for Crandon Boulevard within the Village of Key Biscayne (“Crandon Boulevard Master Plan”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that Interlocal Agreement, a Crandon Boulevard Master Plan was prepared and approved by the Village of Key Biscayne on February 24, 2004; and

WHEREAS, after public hearing in accordance with the requirements of Section 9-2.4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, this Board has determined that the limited modifications to Crandon Boulevard proposed by the Crandon Boulevard Master Plan are necessary and appropriate to provide safe travel along Crandon Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds the modifications proposed by the Crandon Boulevard Master Plan to be consistent with all relevant provisions of the Crandon Park Master Plan,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby approves the modification and redevelopment of Crandon Boulevard from Calusa Circle to the entrance to Cape Florida Park on Key Biscayne, substantially in accordance with the Crandon Boulevard Master Plan approved by the Village Council of the Village of Key Biscayne on

February 24, 2004, in accordance with the requirements of Section 9-2.4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
