

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING SW 102ND
AVENUE FROM SW 32ND STREET TO SW 16TH
STREET AS ARTURO PINO AVENUE

WHEREAS, this Board has conducted a public hearing to consider codesignating SW 102nd Avenue from SW 32nd Street to SW 16th Street as Arturo Pino Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino was born on March 23, 1923 in the city of Banes, Province of Oriente, Cuba; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino spent his childhood in Santiago de Cuba, where he studied a baccalaureate program in the renowned school of Holguin, "Los Amigos". At the University of Havana, he studied agricultural engineering and sugar cane technical expertise and graduated in 1945; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino, in 1951, when the Republican Congress passed an act creating the Agricultural and Industrial Development Bank (known in Spanish as BANFAIC), was awarded the position of manager of the Contramaestre, Oriente Branch and later was promoted to manager of the Bank's Agricultural Division; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino, in 1960, convinced of the wrong direction of Cuba's Affairs, left his much loved homeland for the United States, where he settled down with his beloved wife Mercedes, his lifetime companion; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino, as a result of his wide knowledge and expertise, was appointed as consultant for the Organization of American States (OAS) and started rendering services for the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) headquartered in Washington, D.C. He worked for such organization for 25 years, as head of the Agricultural Planning Division, head of several operational divisions, and representing such entity in Honduras and Costa Rica; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino, after going into well-deserved retirement, settled down in the City of Miami, Florida, where he joined the Cuban Patriotic Board. He was appointed as a member of the International Division and became one of the strong pillars of such coordinating body, devoting his efforts, knowledge, economic contributions and talent in the struggle for Cuba's freedom. He was elected First Vice-President of the Cuban Rotarians in exile, where he contributed his intellectual dynamism. He became actively involved in the Association of Cuban Agricultural Engineers in Exile; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino was a role model of professional dedication and continuous self-improvement, known for his impeccable behavior and patriotism. He was an honest, loving husband as well as a good friend. He devoted his great talent to the struggle for a free Cuba and to the search for development alternatives for this generation as well as the generations to come; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Pino passed away in the City of Miami on December 18, 2003. His passing is an irreparable loss for his wife Mercedes, his family, friends and for the liberation and reconstruction of Cuba; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Arturo Pino with this codesignation; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 10,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board approves the codesignation of SW 102nd Avenue from SW 32nd Street to SW 16th Street as Arturo Pino Avenue.

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Authority, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works Department and Land Development Division of the Public Works Department, the Police Department, and the Fire Department.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Senator Javier D. Souto and offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
