

RESOLUTION CALLING A COUNTYWIDE SPECIAL ELECTION IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, \_\_\_\_\_, 2005 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY THE QUESTION OF WHETHER TO AMEND THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY HOME RULE CHARTER SO THAT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS NO LONGER RECEIVE THE \$6,000 ANNUAL SALARY ESTABLISHED IN 1957, BUT SHALL RECEIVE INSTEAD THE SALARY ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE COUNTY COMMISSION

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County established an annual salary of \$6,000 for County Commissioners in 1957, when the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter was adopted; and

**WHEREAS**, the demands of the position of County Commissioner have grown drastically, but the salary has remained the same; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County is the most populous county in the State of Florida with a population of 2.3 million residents and with a budget in excess of Six (6) Billion dollars; and

**WHEREAS**, the current level of compensation to County Commissioners would not provide County Commissioners a minimum wage as an hourly wage, assuming Commissioners worked a forty (40) hour work week; and

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF  
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. A Countywide special election is hereby called and shall be held in Miami-Dade County, Florida on Tuesday, \_\_\_\_\_, 2005 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of Miami-Dade County the question of whether to amend the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter so that County Commissioners no longer receive the \$6,000 annual salary established in 1957, but shall receive instead the salary established by ordinance of the County Commission following public hearing.

Section 2. The question shall appear on the ballot in substantially the following form:

MIAMI-DADE HOME RULE CHARTER AMENDMENT RELATING TO  
SALARY OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

SHALL THE CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT  
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS NO LONGER RECEIVE THE  
\$6,000 ANNUAL SALARY, BUT INSTEAD RECEIVE AN  
ANNUAL SALARY ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE OF THE  
COUNTY COMMISSION FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEARING  
BEFORE THE COUNTY COMMISSION?

Section 3. Such question shall appear on the ballot as a separate question or proposal. Those qualified electors desiring to adopt or approve such proposal shall be instructed to vote "YES." Those qualified electors desiring to reject or disapprove the proposal shall be instructed to vote "NO."

Section 4. This special election shall be held and conducted in accordance with applicable provisions of the general laws of the State of Florida and the provisions of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter and Code.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Dennis C. Moss and offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:



**BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

**Section 1.06. Salary.**

Each County Commissioner shall receive a salary ~~[[of \$6,000 per year payable monthly]]~~>>in an amount determined by ordinance of the County Commission following public hearing before the County Commission << and shall be entitled to be reimbursed for such reasonable and necessary expenses as may be approved by the Board.
