

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR THE PURPOSES OF DETERMINING A PLAN OF ACTION FOR THE COLLECTION OF BULKY WASTE PRIOR TO AND THROUGHOUT THE HURRICANE SEASON INCLUDING FISCAL AND FUNDING SOURCES AND A METHOD OF INFORMING THE COMMUNITY OF THIS SERVICE

WHEREAS, the County annually faces the prospect of hurricane season and the potential for hurricanes and other tropical storms which may occur during the hurricane season; and

WHEREAS, bulky waste which is scheduled for pickup but which has not yet been picked up throughout the County may pose a threat and a hazard to the citizens of Miami-Dade County in the event of a hurricane; and

WHEREAS, the collection and removal of bulky waste prior to and throughout the hurricane season should be a priority of the County in order to eliminate this potential threat to the citizens of Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby direct the County Manager to conduct a feasibility study to determine a plan of action for the collection of bulky waste prior to and throughout the hurricane season. This feasibility study should include a discussion of the fiscal impact of the plan of action and any funding sources/alternatives available for this program. The plan should include methods of informing the community of this new service and/or change of service to allow for proper use of this service. In informing the public of the plan, the Department should encourage residents to cut trees and dispose of potentially hazardous items in the months before the hurricane season

thereby allowing the use of the available free pick-ups to dispose of these items. The plan shall be returnable to this Board of County Commissioners within ninety (90) days of the approval of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


