

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION URGING THE U.S. CONGRESS AND THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO APPROPRIATE AN ADDITIONAL \$1 MILLION FOR HURRICANE SHUTTERS FOR LOW-INCOME ELDERLY, TARGETED AT CONDOMINIUMS, TOWNHOUSES, APARTMENTS AND MOBILE HOMES

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County has a program through its Community Action Agency called the High Impact Residential Shuttering Program; and

WHEREAS, the High Impact Residential Shuttering Program is funded in part by the State of Florida, Department of Community Affairs and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and

WHEREAS, the High Impact Residential Shuttering Program assists low-income elderly homeowners with hurricane shutter protection for their homes; and

WHEREAS, the Program is limited only to single family, detached residences; and

WHEREAS, low-income residents residing in condominiums, townhouses, apartments and mobile homes are also in need of hurricane shutter protection for their homes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the U.S. Congress and the Florida Legislature to appropriate \$1 million for hurricane shutters for low-income elderly residents, targeted at persons residing in condominiums, townhouses, apartments and mobile homes, in addition to the amount currently appropriated to Project Impact.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this resolution to the Miami-Dade Congressional Delegation and the Chair and members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal and state lobbying team to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in section 1 above. The Office of Intergovernmental Affairs is directed to include this item in the 2006 Federal Legislative Package and the 2006 State Legislative Package.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
