

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO  
PASS LEGISLATION IMPOSING A THREE-FOOT  
CLEARANCE REQUIREMENT RELATED TO MOTORISTS  
SAFELY PASSING BICYCLISTS

**WHEREAS**, on Sunday March 19, 2006, a bicyclist was struck and seriously injured by a motorist on the Rickenbacker Causeway; and

**WHEREAS**, in February, a bicyclist was struck by a car and killed on the Rickenbacker Causeway; and

**WHEREAS**, these accidents are the latest in a series of bicycling accidents that have occurred around Miami-Dade County in recent years; and

**WHEREAS**, while current Florida law requires any vehicle to pass another vehicle "at a safe distance," current Florida law contains no provision that is specifically related to motorists passing or overtaking bicycles; and

**WHEREAS**, other states, including Arizona, Utah, Minnesota, and Wisconsin, have enacted laws that require no less than a three-foot clearance when motorists are passing bicyclists; and

**WHEREAS**, California is currently considering the passage of such a three-foot clearance law; and

**WHEREAS**, the passage of such a law by the Florida Legislature could prevent future accidents involving bicyclists and motorists,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Urges the Florida Legislature to pass legislation imposing a three-foot clearance requirement related to motorists safely passing bicyclists, either through an amendment during the 2006 legislative session if an opportunity arises or through a bill or amendment during the 2007 legislation session.

**Section 2.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

**Section 3.** Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2006 and 2007 State Legislative Packages.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Carlos A. Gimenez and offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
