

**RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO
CONTINUE AND EXPAND THE COLLECTION OF BULKY
WASTE WITHIN THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT
SERVICE AREA AT NO CHARGE TO RESIDENTS**

WHEREAS, the 2006 hurricane season is imminent and the possibility of hurricanes during the season exists; and

WHEREAS, bulky waste which is left on the curbsides in the service area has the possibility of presenting a hazard to area residents; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the repairs that residents make to their houses as insurance pay outs occur, there are continuing build ups of bulky waste at the curbsides within the County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the County Manager is directed to have the Solid Waste Department continue and expand the collection of bulky waste within the Department of Solid Waste Management service area and that the expanded service shall be at no charge to the individual residents. The Manager shall identify a source of additional revenue for the expanded service that does not depend upon or absorb the operating funds of the Solid Waste Department.
