



RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING A PORTION OF
MONROE STREET FROM SW 152ND STREET TO
CARVER DRIVE AS ROBERT C. MCKAY JR. STREET

WHEREAS, this Board has conducted a public hearing to consider codesignating a portion of Monroe Street from SW 152nd Street to Carver Drive as Robert C. McKay Jr. Street; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. was born on March 6, 1960, in Richmond Heights on Monroe Street; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. attended Frank C. Martin Elementary School, Richmond Heights Junior High School and Miami Killian Senior High School; he attended Tennessee State University as a dean's list student for three years, then returned to college at Nova University where he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. was a very spiritual, highly talented, caring, generous, benevolent, loving and charitable person; his focused mission in life was to help people, especially young black boys at risk; he honestly and genuinely worked from the heart without regard for a great deal of fanfare; he was involved in many efforts, merits and dedicated services to the youth and senior citizens, as well as other citizens including the homeless and needy people in the general Miami area, and specifically in

the Richmond Heights Community; he was involved in many activities too numerous to mention; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. truly loved Richmond Heights and enjoyed working with the young and senior citizens of the community; he founded and became the first president of The Concerned and Committee Brothers of the Community Incorporated which sponsored many activities to help other people; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. worked long hours tirelessly to accomplish a mission; most admirably and primarily he worked for the success of the people he was trying to help; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. was a Miami-Dade County School teacher for eleven years and social studies coordinator of his school's Griot Program (An African Verbal Historian and News Storyteller); and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. was what he stood for, and what he advocated and accomplished in his short life of forty-two years; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. McKay, Jr. passed away on October 12, 2005; he is survived by his three sons, Robert C. McKay III, Ray Von, and RaSean; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Robert C. McKay, Jr. for the many charitable and civic contributions he made to the community of Richmond Heights and Miami in general with this codesignation; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 9,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board approves the codesignation of a portion of Monroe Street from SW 152nd Street to Carver Drive as Robert C. McKay Jr., Street.

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works Department and Land Development Division of the Public Works Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.
