RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PROVISION OF IN-KIND SERVICES FROM THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY POLICE, TRANSIT, COMMUNICATIONS AND ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES DEPARTMENTS IN SUPPORT OF THE JUNE 19-22, 2006 TWELFTH INTER-AMERICAN CONFERENCE OF MAYORS SPONSORED BY THE FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY INSTITUTE FOR PUBLIC MANAGEMENT & COMMUNITY SERVICE, A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$30,432.00 TO BE FUNDED IN PART FROM THE COUNTYWIDE IN-KIND RESERVE FUND AND IN PART FROM THE TRANSIT DEPARTMENT DISTRICT BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Twelfth Inter-American Conference of Mayors, sponsored by the Florida International University Institute for Public Management & Community Service, will be held in Miami-Dade County on June 19-22, 2006; and

WHEREAS, the Florida International University Institute for Public Management & Community Service is a not-for-profit organization; and

WHEREAS, the Conference of Mayors will further strengthen the role of local government officials in providing leadership on the major issues common to the Western Hemisphere; and

WHEREAS, the Conference of Mayors is expected to draw several hundred legislative and executive officials from city, regional, and national governments in the Americas and interested parties from private and non-governmental organizations throughout the Americas; and

WHEREAS, the Florida International University Institute for Public Management & Community Service has requested in-kind services from the Miami-Dade County Police, Transit, Communications, and Enterprise Technology Services Departments for the June 19-22, 2006 Conference of Mayors in an amount not to exceed \$30, 432.00 (see attached Fee Waiver/In-Kind Service Application); and

WHEREAS, the Conference of Mayors is a countywide event, and \$19,500.00 of the in-kind services shall be funded from the Countywide In-kind Reserve Fund, and \$10,932.00 of the in-kind services shall be funded from the Transit Department District Budget; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to provide County in-kind services to ensure a successful Conference of Mayors,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the provision of in-kind services from the Miami-Dade Police, Transit, Communications and Enterprise Technology Services Departments in the amount not to exceed \$30,432.00, to be funded in part from the Countywide In-kind Reserve Fund and in part from the Transit Department District Budget in support of the June 19-22, 2006 Twelfth Inter-American Conference of Mayors, as outlined in the attached budget incorporated herein by reference and Exhibit 1.

APPENDIX 'A'

The Inter-American Conference of Mayors and Local Authorities

A Brief Overview

For the last ten years, Miami-Dade County Government has sponsored (and Florida International University has organized for it) the Inter-American Conference of Mayors and Local Authorities. The idea of organizing such an annual conference in Miami-Dade County originated with County Commissioner, Sen. Javier D. Souto and this event rapidly emerged as the largest and most important annual gathering of people concerned with local democracy in the Hemisphere. Over the years the event has received extensive newspaper, television and radio coverage throughout the Hemisphere and has served to significantly demonstrate Miami-Dade County's leadership in the promotion of democracy and good governance in the Americas.

The Inter-American Conference of Mayors has played an important role in shaping the discussions regarding the strengthening of local governments in the Americas. This has been demonstrated by its contributions to the Organization of American State's Summit of the Americas Process and many other comparable events. Indeed, it was a result of efforts originating from the Conference that produced the first recognition by the Hemisphere's Presidents of the importance of local governance for democracy in the region as reflected in the Declaration of the Quebec Summit of 2001.

- Over the past ten years the Inter-American Conference of Mayors has brought to Miami-Dade County about 5,280 local leaders, senior government officials, legislators, governors and senior administrators of the Americas and about 10,560 accompanying visitors to the County. It should be noted that conference attendees cover all of their own participation costs.
- Among the participants from Latin America have been many of the leading figures in the Hemisphere including the chief executives of such cities as Bogota, Medellin and Cali, Colombia; Panama City, Panama; Guatemala City, Guatemala; San Salvador, El Salvador; Santiago, Chile; Cordoba, Argentina; Tegucigalpa, Honduras; Asuncion, Paraguay; Santa Cruz, Bolivia; Quito, Ecuador; Lima, Peru; Monterrey, Mexico; etc.
- Senior high ranking officials of the US Government routinely attend the Conference. In the past these have included the Secretary of US Department of Housing and Urban Development; various assistants to the President of the United States including the White House Representative for Local Governments; the Deputy Director of the US Agency for International Development; US Ambassador to the Organization of American States; and the President of the Inter-American Foundation among others.
- Key leaders of major international organizations have routinely participated. Among them have been the President of the Inter-American Development Bank; the Secretary General of the Organization of American States; senior officials of the World Bank and the United Nations; etc.
- The Inter-American Conference of Mayors has brought to the local hotel industry over \$660,000 just in room revenue. About \$85,800 in local taxes have been related to those rooms (@13%).

- If we assume that each attendee has spent at least \$500 in shopping, dining and entertainment, the Conference has brought about \$2,640,000 to the local economy in the past ten years. This number would be much more if we were to estimate what the accompanying persons have spent while in Miami-Dade County.





Subject: Countywide In-Kind Reserve Request Recommendation

The Office of Strategic Business Management (OSBM) has reviewed the attached in-kind request and recommends for the item to move forward to the Board of County Commissioners for consideration. The countywide in-kind reserve balance allows for the funding of this request.

Background

A waiver for in-kind services is being requested by a not-for-profit organization Florida International University's Institute for Public Management & Community Service for their XII Inter-American Conference of Mayors scheduled for June 19-22, 2006.

In-kind services have been requested in an amount not to exceed \$8,000 from the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) for police services, \$10,932 from Miami-Dade Transit for shuttle bus services, \$500 from the Communications Department for graphic and printing services, \$4,000 from Enterprise Services Technology Department (ETSD) for office equipment, \$7,000 from the International Trade Consortium for staff services for a total in-kind request of \$30,432 to be funded by the countywide in-kind reserve fund.

In FY 2005-06 Florida International University received and award of \$130,000 from the General Fund Discretionary Reserve for this event.

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
