

RESOLUTION URGING THE U.S. POSTAL SERVICE TO PROVIDE
POSTAL RECOGNITION FOR HORSE COUNTRY IN MIAMI-DADE
COUNTY

WHEREAS, Horse Country is a unique and historic area of Miami-Dade County generally bounded by S.W. 117 Avenue, Bird Road, 127 Avenue and Sunset Drive; and

WHEREAS, recognition of Horse Country by the U.S. Postal Service would allow residents of Horse Country to list "Horse Country, Florida" as part of their address and would provide Horse Country with greater visibility and identity,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the U.S. Postal Service to provide postal recognition for Horse Country in Miami-Dade County.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Miami-Dade County Congressional Delegation and the U.S. Postmaster General.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2007 state legislative package.
