
## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution ratifying the application for, acceptance of, and execution of a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) grant for Community-Based Marine Debris Prevention and Removal. On behalf of Miami-Dade County, the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) has applied for up to \$250,000 in grant funding that is being made available through the NOAA National Marine Fisheries Service for community-based marine debris prevention and removal. DERM requested approval to apply for this grant prior to formal Board approval in order to meet the October 31, 2006 application deadline.

## BACKGROUND

The Community-Based Marine Debris Prevention and Removal Program grant is designed by NOAA to help communities implement locally driven, community-based, marine debris prevention and removal projects that benefit coastal habitat, waterways and NOAA resources, including National Marine Sanctuaries. DERM proposed a marine debris removal and prevention effort focusing on bulky debris to be conducted in conjunction with the Department's annual Bayanza activities. Specifically, the Department requested funding to remove sunken vessels and abandoned structures near the area of Card Sound Road (just north of the Dade-Monroe line) and to promote education and awareness about the impacts that bulky marine debris has on our natural resources. If awarded, funding may also be provided to remove large bulky debris, including several boats and hurricane related debris, from offshore spoil islands near Dinner Key. Through these activities, the County can promote stewardship for our valuable natural resources and safeguard our public investment in these areas.

Although the grant proposal is required to focus on marine resource improvements, navigational hazards will also be reduced through the removal of abandoned vessels, thereby helping to protect the lives and safety of commercial and recreational boaters. The grant requires a minimum 1:1 match, which has been met using DERM's annual Bayanza budget, staff and volunteer labor, and other in-kind contributions such as fuel costs for County vehicles used for the project.
