



Subject: Resolution Approving the Appointment of the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District replacement member to the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board

This item was amended during the Governmental Operations and Environment Committee meeting on 3/13/07 to include the names of the one common Director and two common employees of the South Florida Conservation & Development Council, Inc and the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District and to correct a scrivener's error incorrectly naming the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB) instead of the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District (SDSWCD) in the Background section the third and fourth lines.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners select John DeMott to fill the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District (SDSWCD) seat on the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB) as recommended by the SDSWCD. This seat will have a term of three years, ending December 2009, with the option to reappoint for a second term.

Scope

The Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board has a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

Track Record

Background

This recommendation was originally brought before the February 13, 2007 Governmental Operations and Environment Committee. This individual appointment was bifurcated in order to confirm whether there were issues arising from litigation filed by the South Florida Conservation & Development Council, Inc. (Plaintiff) against the County. This issue has been researched and it was determined that SDSWCD and Plaintiff have one Director (S. Cooper McMillan) in common. Additionally, two employees of SDSWCD (Morgan Levy and Sonny Clayton) are also on the Board of Supervisors of Plaintiff.


The APSAB consists of thirteen members representing a variety of agricultural industries. The term for the member representing the SDSWCD expired on December 31, 2006. Section 2-932, Code of Miami-Dade County, requires that the Board of County Commissioners appoint vacancies occurring on the Agricultural Board. This seat will have a term of three years, ending December 2009, with the option to reappoint for a second term.

The nominating organization is required to submit resumes of two qualified individuals to

represent them on the APSAB, and is encouraged to recommend the member they wish to have appointed as representative. The SDSWCD nominations are Mr. John DeMott and Mr. Cooper McMillan with the recommended appointment of Mr. John DeMott.

Mr. John DeMott graduated from the University of Florida with a Bachelor of Science in Animal Biology as well as a second Bachelor of Science in Environmental Horticulture. Mr. DeMott has been the owner and operator of Redland Nursery Inc. since 1972. Mr. Cooper McMillan graduated from the University of Florida with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and is currently owner and operator of his family's farm.

The resumes of these individuals are attached. After reviewing the qualifications of these nominees and considering the recommendations of the SDSWCD, I am recommending Mr. John DeMott as their representative.

WHEREAS, Sections 2-931, 2-932 and 2-933 of the Code of Miami-Dade County provide for the creation, composition, terms, purpose, and duties of the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB); and

WHEREAS, a vacancy of the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District representative seat exists on the APSAB; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-932 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that vacancies on the APSAB are to be filled by the Board of County Commissioners from a slate of nominees selected by the County Manager; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager recommends the appointment of Mr. John DeMott to represent the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District,

ORIGINAL

WHEREAS: Miami-Dade County has established the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB) in 1995 to study and make recommendations pertaining to the regulation of agriculture in Miami-Dade County.

WHEREAS: The South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District, a non-profit, governmental subdivision of the State of Florida, has been effectively working with the agricultural community of Miami-Dade County since 1982 to promote and enhance local agriculture and its concerns for the environmental issues associated with good stewardship of agricultural practices in Miami-Dade County.

WHEREAS: The South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District has had a representative on the APSAB since the APSAB was organized.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District (SDSWCD) Board of Supervisors submits the name of John DeMott, a SDSWCD Supervisor, in accordance with Article LXVII Code of Ordinances, to serve for a three (3) year term on the APSAB to the Department of Planning and Zoning for approval by the County Manager. Mr. DeMott is recommended as the replacement for Colleen Boggs who has successfully completed two three-year terms.

The SDSWCD Board of Supervisors requests that the county manager approve John DeMott for service on the APSAB.
