



RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO  
DEVELOP A PLAN FOR CONSOLIDATION OF THE  
COUNTY'S TRANSIT SYSTEM ROUTE SCHEDULES AND  
MAPS

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade Transit is the 14<sup>th</sup> largest public transit system in the United States and the largest transit agency in the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the Transit Department operates an integrated system of over 100 Metrobus routes with a separate map for each route; the elevated 22-mile Metrorail; the Metromover and the Paratransit Special Transportation Service; and

**WHEREAS**, users of the transit system would benefit from a product that consolidates the County's transit system route schedules and maps; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires that the County Manager or his designee develop a plan for consolidation of the County's transit system route schedules and maps including, but not limited to, a cost analysis, a marketing strategy, and an implementation schedule,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that the County Manager is directed to develop a plan for consolidation of the County's transit system route schedules and maps and to submit said plan and implementation schedule to the Transit Committee within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this resolution.
