Ms. Ginn had a fruitful twenty–year career at the Procter & Gamble Company. She lead the Organizational Development function for the Latin American Division another Organization Development and Human Resource departments of several different line and staff business functions. Her assignments spanned the US, Europe, and Asia.. Prior to her Latin American assignment, she served for two years as an executive on loan to the Superintendent of the Cincinnati Public School System.
