

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution awarding a contract for the construction of the South Terminal Dual Taxiway Project at Miami International Airport, Project No. K-150-A, to Marks Brothers, Inc., in substantially the form on file with the Clerk of the Board, an excerpt of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, and authorize the Mayor or his designee to execute the Agreement and to exercise any cancellation, termination or renewal provisions contained therein.

## **SCOPE**

Miami International Airport (MIA) is located primarily within Commission District Six. However, the impact of this agenda item is countywide in nature as Miami International Airport is a regional asset.

## **FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE**

This project is funded by the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) in the amount of \$2,765,106 and Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funds in the amount of \$8,295,320.

## **TRACK RECORD/MONITOR**

No contractor evaluation report is available for this firm in the Capital Improvements Information System. However, according to the project manager, Marks Brothers has performed in accordance with contract specifications on previous Airport contracts. The Contract/Project Monitor will be E. W. Franklin Stirrup III, MDAD Project Manager.

## **BACKGROUND**

The scope of this project consists of the construction of dual taxiway P and Q which will provide access to the new South Terminal complex, relocation of the jet fuel hydrant system control valve pit in the Concourse H-J area, removal and storage of passenger loading bridges from the Concourse H Headhouse and the repair of any damage to the existing structure resulting from the load bridge removal, removal of high mast apron lighting, construction of a new 9W6 electric ductbank to Concourse H, and the installation of new taxiway centerline lights. The scope also includes miscellaneous airfield pavement work, airfield drainage relocation and other airfield infrastructure work necessary to provide a functional taxiway system.

The project was advertised for bids on May 3, 2007 and bids were received on June 20, 2007 from three (3) firms: Marks Brothers, Inc.; Central Florida Equipment Rentals, Inc.; and Kiewit Southern Co. The Aviation Department's Minority Affairs Division performed a compliance review of the bid submittals and determined that Kiewit Southern Co. did not submit the required DBE utilization form, the Schedule of Participation forms or the DBE Letters of Intent (LOI) and therefore was not in compliance with the contract requirements and as a result were subsequently found non-responsive by the County Attorney's Office. The low bid for this project was submitted by the recommended firm Marks Brothers, Inc. in the amount of \$11,060,426.63.

1. The lowest bid was received from Marks Brothers (\$11,060,426.63) below the Engineer's Estimate (\$13,306,546.58). The difference in estimate between Marks Brothers and the Engineers is due to the difference in some of the bid items unit price, primarily:
  - o Bid Item 2 – Mobilization which is at 37.65% higher than the amount submitted by the lowest bidder.
  - o Bid Item 33 – Off Site Borrow which is 20.03% higher than the amount submitted by the lowest bidder.
  - o Bid Items 67 – Monitoring Wells which is 26.15% higher than the amount submitted by the lowest bidder.

2. The submitted copy of Central Florida Equipment Rentals, Inc. bid form was found to have omitted an amount for item 6 – Maintenance of Airport Airside Traffic. However, the original bid form submitted to the Clerk's office, did include an amount of \$ 1,200,000.00 for this item. As a result Central Florida bid had to be adjusted and their bid increased to \$16,232,457.54
3. On the basis of the foregoing evaluation it is recommended that the Contract be awarded to the lowest responsive bidder, Marks Brothers, Inc. in the amount of Eleven Million, Sixty Thousand, Four Hundred and Twenty-six dollars and Sixty-three Cents (\$11,060,426.63).







The Minority Affairs Division has completed its compliance review of the subject project for compliance with the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program as per the requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations 49 C.F.R. Part 26. The contract measure applicable to this project is a DBE subcontractor goal of 16%.

The attached e-mail, dated July 31, 2007, from the MDAD Project Manager, advised Minority Affairs to proceed with the DBE Compliance Review for Kiewit Southern Company (Attachment 1).

**Kiewit Southern Company** submitted the required DBE Utilization Form, but did not submit Schedule of Participation (SOP) By DBE Firms and the DBE Letter(s) of Intent (LOI) committing to utilize DBE firms. However, Kiewit Southern Company submitted Subcontractor's Supplier Listing to utilize Roberts Traffic Corporation for removal of payment markings, installation of temporary and new marking for \$320,375; Construct Group Corp. for control valve vault, drainage structures for \$1,270,000; Confidence Trucking, Inc. for hauling and dispensing of soil for \$607,000; and Ruben Electric Technology, Inc. for electrical valve for \$876,100 (Attachment 2).

Kiewit Southern Company has met the subcontractor goal of 16% and is in compliance with the DBE Participation Provisions and the Code of Federal Regulations 49 C.F.R. Part 26.

We have verified with Small Business Affairs/DPM that the certifications for the DBE firms are current and valid. If any of the DBE firms listed on the Schedule of Participation as DBE firms are found not to be eligible after award, it must be substituted in accordance with Section IV of the DBE Participation Provisions contained in the project bid documents.


