Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution that recommends Confidential Project #08-00171 be approved as a Qualified Target Industry (QTI) business. The attached documents relating to the support for a QTI tax refund, under the State of Florida QTI tax refund program pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 288.106, have been prepared by the Office of Community and Economic Development in conjunction with the Beacon Council.

Scope

The business operations of this project will bring 66 high-income jobs that will primarily impact Commission District 2, but also will have a positive countywide impact through indirect employment and multiplier effect.

Fiscal Impact / Funding Source

The County uses general revenues to fund this incentive. Confidential Project No. 08-00171 has applied for \$363,000 in QTI funds. The County is requested to participate with \$72,600 (20 percent) in matching funds over a five year period.

Track Record/Monitor

This is an existing business already established in Miami-Dade County. They are seeking to expand their business with a new manufacturing facility to accommodate growth.

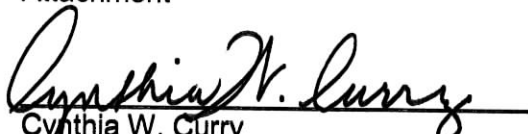
QTI funds provided for job creation are provided as a matching basis upon the State of Florida invoicing the County for jobs created that the State has verified. In essence, the State monitors the creation of the QTI jobs.

Confidential Project No. 08-00171 is a business involved in the manufacturing of panels and equipment. The business is currently in Miami-Dade County and plans to expand its facility for new production lines and equipment.

RESOLUTION APPROVING CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT NO. 08-00171 AS A QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY BUSINESS PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTES S-288.106, CONFIRMING THAT THE COMMITMENTS OF LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT NECESSARY FOR CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #08-00171 EXIST; AND PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF UP TO \$72,600 FROM GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS AS LOCAL PARTICIPATION IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY TAX REFUND PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEARS 2008 THROUGH 2012, INCLUSIVE, OR OVER A TIME PERIOD AS DETERMINED BY THE STATE OF FLORIDA IN ITS APPROVAL OF CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #08-00171 APPLICATION WITH THE PROVISION THAT ANY TAX ABATEMENT GRANTED TO CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #08-00171 UNDER FLORIDA STATUTE 196.1995 REDUCES ANY QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY TAX REFUND TO CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #08-00171 BY THE AMOUNT OF ANY SUCH TAX ABATEMENT GRANTED, IN COMPLIANCE WITH FLORIDA STATUTE 288.106(5)9; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, Economic Impact Overview, and application, copies of which are incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, said industries include enterprises like Confidential Project #08-00171, that relocate, expand or otherwise increase their operations within the County, and which increase employment by at least ten (10) jobs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby finds that attracting, retaining and providing favorable conditions for the growth of target industries provide quality employment opportunities for residents of the County and enhance the County's

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economic foundations and recommends that Confidential Project No. 08-00171 be approved as a qualified target industry business pursuant to Florida Statute 288.16, which created the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program.

The necessary commitment of local financial support for Confidential Project #08-00171, as required under Florida Statute 288.106, exists in an amount not to exceed \$72,600 from General Revenue Funds; and that this local financial support will be available in the following increments:

or payable over a time period and at annual amounts as determined by the State of Florida in its approval of Confidential Project #08-00171 application, as long as the \$72,600 total is not exceeded with the provision that any tax abatement granted to Confidential Project No. 08-00171, under Florida Statute 196.1995, reduces any QTI tax refund by the amount of any such abatement granted, in compliance with Florida Statute 288.106(5)(c); and will be paid to the Florida Economic Development Trust Fund with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent the "local financial support" required by Florida Statute 288.106 for Confidential Project #08-00171 in compliance with the QTI Program, including the requirement that at least ten (10) jobs be created.

The necessary commitment of local financial support shall be contingent on Confidential Project No. 08-00171 maintaining the jobs during the life of the incentive and ensuring that its hiring practices are consistent with and reflect the diversity of the Miami-Dade County community.
