RESOLUTION URGING MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO REJECT PROPOSALS TO CLOSE CERTAIN HIGH-PERFORMING SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County Public Schools (the “School Board”), like other local governments throughout the State of Florida, face difficult budget decisions as a result of potential budget cuts by the Florida Legislature and proposals to reduce property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the School Board is considering proposals to significantly reduce operating costs by closing 10 underenrolled elementary and middle schools, “repurposing” the buildings for other educational uses such as community learning centers or regional offices, and relocating the students from the closed schools to other public schools; and

WHEREAS, among the schools being considered for repurposing is Emerson Elementary School, which has a capacity of 600 students but has a current enrollment of 394 students; and

WHEREAS, the current proposal would relocate the Emerson students to Banyan Elementary School, which has a capacity of 740 students but has a current enrollment of 360 students; and

WHEREAS, although a policy of closing low-performing schools and transferring students to higher-performing schools would be sensible because it would afford those students with an opportunity for a better education, both Emerson Elementary and Banyan Elementary Schools are very high-performing schools whose excellent academic performance could be adversely impacted by the proposed merger; and

WHEREAS, parents whose children currently attend Emerson Elementary have expressed concern that the closing of Emerson Elementary would affect not only the children who benefit from the educational opportunities offered by a high-performing school but also the entire community and area businesses; and

WHEREAS, the policy of increasing enrollment at schools with under-enrollment in order to reduce operating costs must be balanced with the policy to maximize the number of schools that are performing at high academic standards,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges Miami-Dade County Public Schools to reject any proposals to reduce operating costs by closing high-performing schools such as Emerson Elementary School and Banyan Elementary School.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this resolution to the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County School Board and the Superintendent of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Senator Javier D. Souto and offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
