**Subject:** Resolution Adding Cutler Wetlands North Addition Hammock to the Environmentally  
Endangered Lands (EEL) Program Priority B Acquisition List

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution adding Cutler Wetlands North Addition Hammock to the EEL Priority B List. This resolution is based on the unanimous recommendations of the Land Acquisition Selection Committee (LASC) following their December 10, 2007 public hearing.

## **Scope**

The EEL Program is countywide in nature.

## **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

Cutler Wetlands North Addition Hammock will be placed on the EEL Priority B Acquisition List for which EEL funds can pay no more than 50% of the purchase price of the property. The County's 50% share could be paid from the current or future EEL allocation of Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond (GOB) funds or, if GOB funds are unavailable, the EEL Acquisition Trust Fund. The remaining 50% match can be in the form of a donation, grant, funding partner or other source. The matching funds will be determined at a later date and the value of the parcels will be determined by appraisal during the acquisition process.

## **Background**

The Cutler Wetlands North Addition Hammock proposed for addition to the EEL Priority B List consists of 37 acres within two non-contiguous natural areas located west and south of the privately owned Palmetto Bay Village Center/former Burger King Headquarters complex (see Attachment A). The natural areas consist of mixed upland forest (transitional pineland and hammock), transverse glade (exotics-dominated freshwater wetlands), exotics-dominated coastal wetlands, herbaceous flats, white mangroves and a small band of dense and sparse scrub mangroves. The diversity of the natural habitats on the property and their high degree of biological continuity with adjacent and nearby natural areas, such as the coastal areas of Biscayne National Park, are clearly beneficial to high wildlife usage and biological diversity. The area is considered a high conservation priority by Biscayne National Park.

A zoning covenant that contained provisions for a vegetation buffer was executed in 1985 when the land was originally developed. Since then, the land has been incorporated into

the Village of Palmetto Bay and Miami-Dade County has relinquished zoning authority to the Village. The County Attorney's Office has reviewed the covenant and determined that the zoning covenant runs with the land and the Village now has jurisdiction over the covenant. A release or modification of the zoning covenant could be exercised by the Village. The County retains no authority to enforce the terms of the zoning covenant. Furthermore, the native vegetation buffer provisions of the zoning covenant apply only to an area along Old Cutler Road, not to the entirety of the lands that the EEL program is hoping to acquire at this site.
