**Subject:** Resolution Authorizing the Filing of a Grant Application on behalf of Miami-Dade County with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in Fiscal Year (FY) 07 Section 5309 Discretionary Funds to Purchase 16 60-ft Hybrid Buses

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the execution and filing of a grant application on behalf of Miami-Dade County with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for \$13,845,000 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2007 Section 5309 discretionary funds to purchase sixteen (16) sixty-foot hybrid buses to operate along the I-95 Managed Lanes project. It is further recommended that the Board authorize this grant agreement pursuant to the application, as well as the receipt and expenditure of funds as specified in the agreement.

A public hearing is required in accordance with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) regulations.

## **SCOPE**

As these funds provide support for a major bus corridor along I-95, the impact of this grant will be countywide.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

There will be no fiscal impact to the County since the required local match in the amount of \$3,461,250 will be provided by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) through the use of Toll Revenue Credits (TRC), a "soft match". Section 1111 of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA-21) made permanent earlier statutory provisions which permit a state to count as a credit for a project's local share certain expenditures that a state makes with toll revenues. Where applicable, Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) requests toll revenue credits from FDOT. Once an amount is approved, the toll revenue credit is incorporated with the Federal grant application to serve as the local match.

## **TRACK RECORD/MONITOR**

MDT has entered into numerous funding agreements with USDOT over the course of more than twenty-five (25) years. The project manager for this grant application is Doug Greist, Manager, MDT Budget and Management Services.

## **DELEGATED AUTHORITY**

In accordance with Section 2.8-3 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to identifying delegations of Board authority, there are no authorities beyond that specified in the resolution which include authority for the Mayor or his designee to execute the agreement and expend funds.

**BACKGROUND**

In August 2007, the USDOT announced the selection of five cities as Urban Partners and committed more than \$400 million in discretionary bus program funds to support the transit elements of its Urban Partnership Program; which also included elements involving tolling (congestion pricing), technology, and telecommuting. The other urban areas selected to participate in the transit element of the Urban Partnership Program were San Francisco, Minneapolis, New York City, and Seattle.


The Miami-Area Urban Partner Agreement is comprised of FDOT, Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO), MDT, Broward County Transit (BCT), the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority (MDX), and the Florida Turnpike Enterprise. The Urban Partnership project is the conversion of 21-miles of two high-occupancy (HOV) lanes (in both directions) along I-95, from I-395 in Miami to I-595 in Fort Lauderdale into variably-priced high-occupancy toll (HOT) lanes.

The Miami Urban Partnership was awarded a total of \$19,500,000; Broward County was awarded \$5,655,000, and Miami-Dade County was awarded the balance of the \$13,845,000. The award to Miami-Dade County is specifically for the purchase of sixteen (16) sixty-foot hybrid buses to operate along the I-95 Managed Lanes project. The project was incorporated as an amendment to the FY 2008 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and was approved by the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Governing Board on October 4, 2007.

The I-95 Managed Lanes project will essentially be implemented in several phases. Initially, the northbound managed lanes between State Road 112 and the Golden Glades Interchange will begin bus rapid transit (BRT) service, followed by the southbound managed lanes between those same two points. As presently scheduled, in late 2009, both northbound and southbound lanes will open north of the Golden Glades Interchange to I-595/Broward Boulevard, respectively.

Initial operating funds for this project will be provided over the next five years from FDOT's Transportation Trust Fund. Presently, a range from \$1-1.2 million per year for fiscal years 2009 through 2013 has been identified to support operation of the buses along I-95. FDOT will also consider the possibility of toll revenue credits at a later time as an additional or replacement source for future operating support. To achieve the goals of this project, MDT will adjust its service accordingly to remain within its budgetary limitations.

In order to ensure the obligation of these funds, MDT, at the request of FTA, has already implemented the application process and subsequent Federal review process.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A GRANT APPLICATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007 SECTION 5309 DISCRETIONARY FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$13,845,000 WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UNDER THE URBAN PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF GRANT AGREEMENT PURSUANT TO SUCH APPLICATION; AND AUTHORIZING THE RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS AS SPECIFIED IN THE AGREEMENT

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purpose outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, it is required by the USDOT, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1994, that the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the USDOT requirement thereunder; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board conducted a public hearing on Miami-Dade County's Urban Partnership Program Section 5309 discretionary funds grant application as described in the accompanying memorandum; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Florida is authorized to enter into an agreement to provide State Toll Revenue Credits (TRC's) as a soft match for federal funding for transportation programs and projects, when available,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY  
COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. That this Board authorizes the County Mayor, his designee, or the Miami-Dade Transit Director (MDT), to file a grant application with the USDOT for \$13,845,000 in FY 07 Section 5309 discretionary funds to purchase sixteen (16) sixty-foot hybrid buses to operate along the I-95 Managed Lanes project and to utilize TRC's totaling \$3,461,250 as a soft match for this project.

Section 2. That the County staff is authorized to furnish such additional information as the USDOT and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) may require in connection with the grant application for the project.

Section 3. That the County Mayor is authorized to set forth and execute disadvantaged business enterprises policies in connection with the projects should such funds become available.

Section 4. That this Board further authorizes the County Mayor, his designee, or the MDT Director to execute such contracts and agreements as are approved by the County Attorney's Office, to receive and expend funds in accordance with such aforementioned contracts and agreements; and to file and execute any additional agreements, revisions, or amendments as required to carry out the projects for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

**RECOMMENDATION**

The Transportation Planning Council (TPC) recommends approval of an amendment to the FY 2008 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funding for the purchase of sixteen sixty-foot hybrid buses for the transit operation of the I-95 Express Lanes Project.

**BACKGROUND**

The proposed amendment will add \$13,845,000 in FTA funding as part of the Urban Partnership for the I-95 Express Managed Lanes Project. This funding will enable Miami-Dade Transit to purchase sixteen (16) sixty-foot hybrid buses to operate new transit service along I-95 to downtown Miami from Broward County Park and Ride Lots at Broward Blvd. and Sheridan Street.
