Recommendation

The attached Work Order Approval Recommendation between Carney-Neuhaus, Inc. and Miami-Dade County has been prepared by the Public Works Department (PWD) and is recommended for approval. Proceeds from the Charter County Transit System Sales Surtax (the Surtax) will be used to fund this Work Order, therefore, approval by the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) and Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) is required.

Scope

The PTP Roadway Project along NW 87 Avenue, from NW 154 Street to NW 186 Street, is located within Commission District 13.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact will be approximately \$23,460.00 and will be funded from the Surtax. This site-specific project is included in Exhibit 1 of the PTP Ordinance under the Major Highway and Roadway Improvements.

Delegation of Authority

No additional authority is being requested within the body of this contract.

Track Record/Monitor

PWD has reviewed records concerning Carney-Neuhaus, Inc.'s performance and found that this consultant has carried out four (4) County projects, two (2) have been PWD projects and the remaining projects were completed for DERM and WASD. Throughout all People's Transportation Plan (PTP) projects, the responsible staff person in PWD will continue to be the PTP Coordinator, Mr. Frank Aira, P.E. Following completion of the award process, the project will be assigned to Hector Aleman, P.E., PWD Highways Division, for day to day responsibilities.

The principal engineer for Carney-Neuhaus, Inc. is Eleanor J. Carney, P.E. The primary office is located at 2020 NE 163rd Street, Suite 300, North Miami Beach, Florida 33162.

Background

Administrative Order No. 3-26 established the threshold and guidelines for Feasibility and Value Analysis/Engineering (VA/E) Studies for Miami Dade County construction projects. Accordingly, a VA/E Study is to be performed to compare design alternatives, their feasibility and cost benefits for the NW 87 Avenue Roadway Project. PWD staff determined that the scope of work for this project resides within the guidelines of the Equitable Distribution Program (EDP) available under

the supervision of the Office of Capital Improvements (OCI). The EDP allows various County Departments to access a pool of available, qualified engineering firms for small projects and studies. Specifically, the program is limited to design of projects with a construction limit of \$1 million, or traffic engineering studies up to \$50,000.00. An EDP consultant request form was submitted to OCI with the project scope, estimated cost and qualifying engineering categories. OCI provided three (3) firms from the EDP rotating pool which were qualified for the subject work. PWD evaluated each firm's project proposal, resumes and performance history. As a result of this competitive selection process, PWD selected Carney-Neuhaus, Inc. for this project, with the stipulation that approval for the work orders must be obtained from the BCC and the CITT due to guidelines associated with the funding source.

The cost and time associated with the engineering services in this Work Order has been negotiated at \$23,460.00 and 45 calendar days, respectively.

Carney-Neuhaus, Inc. appreciates the opportunity to present this proposal for professional services in connection with conducting Value Analysis/Value Engineering for a project entitled N.W. 87th Avenue Improvements from N.W. 154 St. to N.W. 186 St. As Principal-in-Charge, I will be leading a team of highly qualified and experienced professionals with expertise in the various disciplines required to conduct value analysis in the subject project. An executed Assignment and Agreement Form for the Equitable Distribution Program in the Miami-Dade Public Works Department's format is also provided. Enclosed is our revised proposal based on comments received from your emails of March 7, 12, and 13, 2008.

TECHNICAL PROPOSAL

Based on information provided from you in emails dated March 12, 2008, it is our understanding that the design of the project will be 60 percent complete at the beginning of this value engineering work. For the purpose of this proposal, we have assumed that Value Analysis/Value Engineering (VAVE) will be completed in one stage: 60% design for value engineering/analysis.

The Value Engineering/Analysis will review the plans and contract documents along with the cost estimates completed to date by ADA, the design consultant,

and other plans prepared for Public Works for N.W 87 Ave. from N.W. 162 to N.W. 170 Sts. The analysis may result in other alternatives being recommended.

The project shall be conducted following a basic procedure centered on a project team workshop analysis session, with necessary preparatory time before and completion of the report after the workshop. This process has worked well for us on other VAVE engagements we have done for the County. The workshop will evaluate the 60% design and perform a cost savings analysis.

The task analysis is presented later in this letter. The budget for the project is presented along with the description of the team's approach to the value analysis process in that section.

PROJECT SCOPE

The scope of the project as defined by MD Public Work's is as follows:

The project consists of widening of the existing roadway along N.W. 87 Ave. to 4 lanes from N.W. 166 Terrace to N.W. 186 St. and construction of new 4 lane road from N.W. 154 St to approximately N.W. 163 St. also along N.W. 87 Avenue. The improvements include a raised median, landscaping, sidewalks, curb and gutter, continuous storm drainage system, pavement markings, signing, lighting and replacing the existing aging culvert with a new one in its same location on N.W. 170 St. The Project is approximately 2.0 miles long.

TASK ANALYSIS AND COST ESTIMATE

Based on previous experience and our understanding of the project to be analyzed, we have identified the tasks to be done and estimated the amount of time needed for adequate effort to be applied. Of course, if significant changes to the scope are requested (such as significant additional materials to be reviewed and considered or more detailed analysis of the various alternatives presented to management), this effort might need to be augmented. We would discuss this situation with you and get your approval before doing any such additional work.

On the next page are the tables of work tasks and corresponding fees. The following tables include a description of the value engineering tasks and their associated fees based on the personnel assigned to the task. The total fees for the project including the fees projected for all the tasks are shown in the grand total.

The term Architect/Engineer shall include its officials, successors, legal representatives, and assigns.

The scope of services include, but are not limited to, complete professional architectural, civil engineering, structural, mechanical/plumbing engineering, electrical engineering and landscape design services, construction engineering and inspection services, as may be required by any applicable work authorization issued under this Agreement.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Consultant is an approved participant in the County's Equitable Distribution Program (EDP) to provide architectural, engineering and architectural landscape services on an as needed basis for County projects in which the construction costs and/or in which the study activity service fees do not exceed the limits established by the Florida Statutes, Section 287.055 and based upon any work authorizations issued hereunder that shall conform to the Scope of Services within the categories of technical certification as determined by the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

identified in the work authorization and the method of compensation determined and agreed to, prior to proceeding with the work authorization.

User departments submit the work assignment request including a detailed scope of work to OCI for assignment of appropriate design professionals in the EDP.

The user department shall review the qualifications of the prime firms provided by OCI and select the most qualified firm. Provided the prime firm is in compliance with the program mandates, Departments will proceed with negotiating the services. If a prime firm is certified in all of the required technical certification categories, it may perform the required services with its own work force otherwise the prime shall select authorized EDP sub consultant from the firms provided by OCI.

If negotiations fail with the most qualified firm, the user department shall immediately notify OCI of such failure and begin negotiations with the next most qualified firm.

Firms that demonstrate an inability to effectively respond to EDP request for services and adherence to the project schedules will be given written notice to improve their performance. In addition, user department shall evaluate the performance of the EDP consultant upon completion of the service order. Poor performance may result in suspension from the program.

If a Department requires specific expertise within a particular technical certification, OCI is authorized to survey firms within the EDP rotation for the assignment. Additionally, OCI may, upon the written request of the user department director, approve a specific firm qualified in the appropriate technical areas when deemed in the best interest of the County.

Firms will be required to report to the user agency all fees earned as a prime and/or sub consultant on each EDP assignment.

In the event that any work authorization shall be cancelled or changed, the using agency shall forward such information to the OCI and all affected outstanding fees of each respective firm shall be credited and their position within the EDP Pool shall be adjusted.

3.72 Utilization Report (UR): Pursuant to County requirements, Consultants are required to report all monies received and paid for professional services including payments to Sub consultants(s) if applicable to the user agency. The EDP utilization reporting shall be in accordance with OCI and DBD Policies and Procedures.

3.8 TERM OF AGREEMENT:

This term of this Agreement shall begin upon execution by the parties and shall be in effect until all Services are completed or until those Services Orders in force at the end of the stated period of time have been completed and the Services accepted, whichever may be later. This Agreement will expire on September 30, 2011.

Nothing in this Article shall prevent the County from exercising its rights to terminate the Agreement as provided elsewhere herein.

- 9.6 Costs for material testing authorized by the County.
- 9.7 Costs for mailing of bid documents (if required).
- 9.8 Courier services to deliver documents (if required).
- 9.9 Rental of specialized equipment and purchase of special instruments necessary for the efficient performance of the work, provided that such instruments remain the property of the County upon completion of the work and authorization was granted for the purchase by the County.
- 9.10 Items not listed shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and shall be approved in advance by the Director or his/her designee.

ARTICLE 10 - SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The following provisions are to be used AS APPLICABLE:

Contract Measures are not applicable to this contract, however, the consultant selected for a work assignment under this contract is required to comply with the specific local and federal guidelines applicable to the particular County Agency requesting the services of the consultant. The specific participation requirements shall be discussed by the individual Agency with the selected consultant and made a part of the service order for each project assignment.


