Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve a petition submitted in accordance with Article 1, Chapter 18 of the Code, for creation of the Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District. The creation of this District is requested pursuant to petition submitted by the residents of the Sky Lake neighborhood.

Scope

This proposed special taxing district is located within Commission District Four (4) and will provide roving patrol security services.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Creation of this District will result in no economic impact on the County's budget except the advancement of funds from various Departments for expenditures or labor and materials necessary to process the District. All District costs incurred will be reimbursed to each Department after the BCC adopts the District's preliminary assessment roll, ratification of BCC action by registered voters through mailed ballot, and the anticipated collection of assessments on the affected property owner's November 2008 annual tax bill.

After the first year, the economic impact on the private sector will be a perpetual annual special assessment for the cost of security guard service to all property owners within the District.

At this time there will be no increase or decrease in County staffing due to this District. The private sector may increase its staffing levels to provide the service requirements created by this special taxing district.

Track Record/Monitoring

The Public Works Department's Special Taxing Districts Division will monitor compliance with the terms and conditions of a contract with a private off-duty police officer service provider.

State or Federal grants are not applicable to this special taxing district.

Each security guard special taxing district is unique due to its geographical boundaries, affected property owners, and level of services to be provided. Creation of a new ordinance to provide this service is the best and most cost-effective method to achieve this benefit.

In accordance with the requirements of Section 18-3 of the Code, I have reviewed the facts submitted by the Public Works Director and concur with her recommendation that this District be created, if approved by the referendum required subsequent to this public hearing.

ORDINANCE CREATING AND ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, KNOWN AND DESCRIBED AS SKY LAKE ROVING PATROL SECURITY GUARD SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Amendment to the Florida Constitution (Article VIII, Section 6) grants to the electors of Miami-Dade County power to adopt a home rule charter of government for Miami-Dade County, Florida, and provides that such charter may provide a method for establishing special taxing districts and other governmental units in Miami-Dade County from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Charter adopted by the electors of Miami-Dade County on May 21, 1957, provides that the Board of County Commissioners, as the legislative and the governing body of Miami-Dade County, shall have the power to establish special purpose districts within which may be provided essential facilities and services, including police protection services, and that all funds for such districts shall be provided by service charges, special assessments, or general tax levies within such districts only, and that the County Commission shall be the governing body of all such districts; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such provisions of the Florida Constitution and the Home Rule Charter, the Board of County Commissioners duly enacted Chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, providing for the creation and establishment of special taxing districts and prescribing the procedures therefore; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a petition for the creation of a special taxing district to be known as the SKY LAKE ROVING PATROL SECURITY GUARD SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT duly signed by more than 50% of the resident owners of property within the proposed district, was filed with the Clerk of the County Commission. Such petition prayed for the creation and establishment of a special taxing district for the purpose of providing roving patrol security services to be financed solely by means of special assessments levied and collected within the area therein and hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of such petition the Clerk of the County Commission transmitted a copy thereof to the County Manager who examined it and filed a written report with the Clerk certifying that such petition was sufficient in form and substance and signed and properly presented in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager, after making appropriate investigations, surveys, plans and specifications, compiled and filed with the Board of County Commissioners his written report and recommendations setting forth the boundaries of the proposed special taxing district, the location, nature and character of the roving patrol security services to be provided and maintained within the proposed district, his certification that the proposed district conform to the master plan of development for the County, and setting forth his recommendations concerning the need for and desirability of the requested services, the ability of the affected property to bear special assessments for financing the cost of providing such services, and an estimate of the amount to be assessed against each developed and/or vacant/underdeveloped benefited parcel of property within the proposed district, and expressing his opinion that the property to be specially assessed will be benefited in excess of the special assessments to be levied, and the County Manager attached to such report and recommendations a map or sketch showing the boundaries and location of the proposed district. Such Report and Recommendations of the County Manager was filed with the Clerk and transmitted to the Chairperson; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Board of County Commissioners from such report of the County Manager and other investigations that the district petitioned for would be of special benefit to all property within the proposed boundaries and that the total amount of the special assessments to be levied would not be in excess of such special benefit; the Clerk of the Board certified the place, date and hour for a public hearing on the petition of the owner/developer/petitioner and the report and recommendations of the County Manager -- said hearing was held on Tuesday,

. Copies of the public notice were duly published in a newspaper of general circulation published in Miami-Dade County, Florida, and copies thereof were posted in not less than five (5) public places within the proposed district, and copies thereof were mailed to all owners of taxable real property within the boundaries of the proposed district as their names and addresses appear on the latest Miami-Dade County Real Property Tax Roll; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said notice, the Board of County Commissioners on Tuesday, , held a public hearing, at which all interested persons were afforded the opportunity to present their objections, if any, to the creation and establishment of the proposed special taxing district; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, upon review and consideration of the report and recommendations of the County Manager and the views expressed by the property owners within the proposed special taxing district, has determined to create and establish such special taxing district in accordance with the report and recommendations of the County Manager,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a special taxing district located partially within a portion of the City of North

Miami Beach, Florida and partially within a portion of unincorporated Miami-Dade County, Florida, known and designated as the SKY LAKE ROVING PATROL SECURITY GUARD SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT is hereby created and established.

Section 2. The area or boundaries of this proposed special taxing district are as follows:

A portion of Section 4, Township 52 South, Range 42 East, Miami-Dade County, Florida; being more particularly described as follows:

The south 105.00 feet of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 4;

And

All the above named plats are recorded in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County.

The area and location of this proposed special taxing district are shown on the map or sketch which is made a part hereof by reference.

Section 3. The improvements and services to be provided within this proposed special taxing district will consist of the following:

A roving security patrol service, provided by off-duty police,
24 hours per day, 365 days per year.

Section 4. The estimated cost to the property owners for the security guard services including engineering, administrative, billing, collecting and processing for the first year is

\$552,500, and \$454,000 for each year thereafter. The County will advance funds for this program, which sum shall be reimbursed by special assessments. It is estimated that the cost per developed parcel of real property within the proposed district for the first year is \$801 and \$658 for the second and succeeding years. It is estimated that the cost per vacant/undeveloped parcel of real property within the proposed district for the first year is \$401 and \$329 for the second and succeeding years. It is estimated that the cost per multifamily residences/parcel of real property within the proposed district for the first year is \$1,602 and \$1,316 for the second and succeeding years.

Section 5. It is hereby declared that said services will be a special benefit to all property within the proposed special taxing district and the total amount of special assessments to be levied as aforesaid will not be in excess of such special benefit.

Section 6. The County Manager is hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary steps to solicit and receive competitive bids in accordance with established County procedures, and/or, in his discretion, enter into an interlocal agreement or service agreement with off-duty police officers for providing security guard services within the district.

Section 7. The County Manager is directed to cause to be prepared and filed with the Clerk of the County Commission a Preliminary Assessment Roll in accordance with the provisions of Section 18-14 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. As authorized by Section 197.363, Florida Statutes, all special assessments levied and imposed under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be collected, subject to the provisions of Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, in the same manner and at the same time as ad valorem taxes. In accordance with utilization of the ad valorem tax collection method, if such special assessments are unpaid, when due, the potential for loss of title to the property exists.

Section 8. A duly certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and recorded in the appropriate book of records.

Section 9. The provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect when approved at an election to be formally called by this Board and noticed and conducted as this Board shall determine by Resolution, unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board and an approval by a majority of those voting at the election referred to herein.

**REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS
ON THE CREATION OF SKY LAKE ROVING PATROL
SECURITY GUARD SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**

Pursuant to Chapter 18 of the Code, and as a result of a detailed investigation of a duly petitioned for special taxing district, the following facts are submitted by the Public Works Director concerning the creation of Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District.

1. BOUNDARIES OF THIS DISTRICT

The proposed District is located within a portion of unincorporated Miami-Dade County and a portion of the City of North Miami Beach. Pursuant to Chapter 18 of the Code, Miami-Dade County has received approval from the City of North Miami Beach to create this special district per Resolution No. R-2008-16, a copy of which is attached. The District's original petition boundaries were expanded by the petitioner during the petition drive to include twenty-five properties south of NE 199th Street along NE 22nd Avenue and two properties south of NE 199th Street along NE 19th Avenue. The boundaries were further expanded upon review by the Public Works Department to include two properties south of NE 199th Street along NE 19th Court which will also receive benefit from the planned roving patrol service. Therefore, the general boundaries of the Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District are now:

On the North, N.E. 199th Street;
On the East, N.E. 22nd Avenue;
On the South, NE 185th Street;
On the West, N.E. 18th Avenue;

and are more fully described as follows:

All the above named plats are recorded in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County.

The boundaries are shown on the attached plan entitled Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District and hereinafter referred to as Exhibit A.

A preliminary meeting was held on May 1, 2008, at Highland Oaks Middle School, at which time the property owners in attendance were presented the facts pertaining to the boundaries of this District, a description of the security service to be provided, its costs and the method of payment.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED

The service will be a visible safety and mobile security program consisting of one off-duty police officer in a marked police vehicle operating 24 hours per day, 365 days a year. The service level will be reviewed with the owners of property within the District prior to renewal or reletting of a service contract as an integral part of this District's budget process.

This service will be provided by off-duty Florida Highway Patrol officers. In the event that the services of off-duty police officers cannot be secured, the County may provide unarmed service through a State of Florida licensed and bonded security guard firm under contract with Miami-Dade County. The service, as administered by the Miami-Dade County Public Works Department, will commence at the earliest practicable time, following the creation and establishment of the District by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) and said creation ratified by the electorate at the required subsequent referendum.

3. ESTIMATED COST FOR THIS SERVICE

The request made by the petitioners is for off-duty police officer security service as indicated in Section 2 of this report. The estimated service cost is based upon the hourly rate obtained through County experience with similar Florida Highway Patrol service providers. For this report, an average estimated

hourly rate of \$45.00 for the mobile off-duty police officer in a marked vehicle was multiplied by the annual number of hours of security service for an estimated annual total service cost of \$395,000. In addition to the cost for the security service, a deposit of \$33,000 to ensure a minimum of 30 days service was also included.

In addition to the cost for the security service, general liability insurance is estimated at \$10,000 annually and cellular phone service at \$1,000 annually. It will also be necessary for the County to recover the engineering and contract administrative costs incurred to establish and maintain the District as provided by Chapter 18 of the Code. This is estimated to be \$12,000 the first year and \$6,000 annually thereafter. Also, it will be necessary for the County to charge the District a fee for handling the billing, advertising, collecting, processing the monthly invoices to the security service provider and election costs. This cost is estimated to be \$9,500 for the first year and \$1,000 annually thereafter. Also, contingency funds in the amount of \$92,000 for the first year and \$41,000 annually thereafter are provided. Therefore, the first year total cost is estimated to be \$552,500 and the second year total cost is estimated to be \$454,000. Succeeding year's costs will be determined on an annual basis.

4. PROCEDURE

Prior to commencement of service, the Mayor or his designee, on behalf of Miami-Dade County will secure the services of off-duty Florida Highway Patrol officers or duly approved security guards wherein it is agreed that the County will pay the service providers through a contract, in equal monthly payments, one twelfth of the annual cost now estimated to be \$395,000 or approximately \$32,900 per month.

Each property owner in the District will pay the County, by special assessment on a unit basis, a proportionate share of the total annual cost. This cost will be shown as an itemized portion of the annual ad valorem tax bill.

5. CONFORMITY TO THE MASTER PLAN OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

The proposed District conforms to and in no way conflicts with the Comprehensive Development Master Plan of Miami-Dade County (see attached memorandum from the Department of Planning and Zoning).

6. RECOMMENDATION CONCERNING THE DESIRABILITY OF THIS DISTRICT

The proposed security program is desirable as evidenced by the property owners' petition. The net property valuation of \$167,537,397 based on the 2007 Miami-Dade County Real Estate Property Cards is a good indication that the affected property is able to support such assessments as may be required. In my opinion, the proposed improvement will provide special benefits to properties within the District equal to or exceeding the amount of special assessments to be levied.

7. ESTIMATE OF ASSESSMENT AGAINST BENEFITED PROPERTY

The combined estimated annual cost for the security service and other expenses as estimated and indicated in Item 3 above is \$552,500 the first year and \$454,000 the second year, with succeeding years' cost determined annually. The cost is to be paid for by special assessment against benefited properties and is to be apportioned to individual properties within the boundaries of the District on a unit basis. The cost per unit to be assessed for this service is estimated as follows:

These costs are based on a preliminary estimate of 690 units and will be adjusted from actual experience.

8. RECOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that the creation, financing and implementation of the District be authorized by an ordinance to be adopted by the BCC, subject to ratification by the District's electorate at a special referendum to be called by the BCC. It is also recommended that upon adoption of the ordinance creating this special taxing district, the BCC adopt, as the next agenda item, a resolution calling for a special election as required by Chapter 18 of the Code. Said election will be conducted by the Miami-Dade County Elections Department using a mailed ballot along with a project report summary provided to each District registered voter. It is further recommended that the BCC adopt the District's preliminary assessment roll resolution. Adoption of this resolution will enable the Miami-Dade County Tax Collector to bill the affected property owners, collection of which will provide the funds necessary to reimburse affected County Agencies involved in the creation and establishment of the District, as well as provide funding for the improvement provided by the District. The implementation of the assessment roll will follow the procedures defined in Chapter 18 of the Code and be subject to District ratification by the qualified electorate. It is anticipated that the assessment will appear on the November 2008, and subsequent year's tax bill following the election, if approved by the electorate. In the event actual costs are lower than the estimated costs in the ordinance, the Director of the

Public Works Department or her designee may adjust and decrease the unit rate of assessment necessary to provide adequate revenue to cover District expenses. In the event actual costs are higher than the costs estimated in the ordinance, the County Manager shall cause to be prepared a revised preliminary assessment roll and file the same with the Clerk of the Board for a scheduled public hearing to adopt the revised assessment roll. The ordinance shall take effect when ratified at an election to be formally called, noticed and conducted as the BCC shall determine by resolution unless vetoed by the Mayor. If vetoed, it shall become effective only upon an override by the BCC and District approval at the subsequent election. My office also be available to answer any questions from the public or your office with regards to the financial and/or engineering facts of this District. We further recommend that the County Manager forward the attached report to the BCC after he has reviewed it and concurred with our findings.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE CREATION OF THE SKYLAKE ROVING PATROL SECURITY GUARD SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT IN THE SKYLAKE NEIGHBORHOOD SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF A SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT AND COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE REQUIREMENTS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, the Skylake Community has petitioned Miami-Dade County for the creation of a special taxing district for a roving patrol security guard protecting the residential area, a portion of which lies within the City of North Miami Beach, with the following proposed boundaries: North, NE 198th Terrace; South, NE 185th Street; East, NE 22nd Avenue; and West, NE 18th Avenue, pursuant to Chapter XVIII of the Code of Metropolitan Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the City of North Miami Beach intends to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Miami-Dade County allowing the County to collect funds during the first fiscal year of the special taxing district to pay for any necessary equipment expenditures related to the roving patrol security guard, and thereafter to fund the ongoing costs of the roving patrol security guard.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of North Miami Beach, Florida.

Section 1. The City of North Miami Beach hereby authorizes the County to create the Skylake Roving Patrol Special Taxing District without restraining stipulations or conditions, and to levy special assessments in support of this service.

Section 2. The City agrees that the County will purchase all necessary equipment for the operation of the district.

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
Section 3. The City does not guarantee that off-duty police services will be made available to provide district services but would not be opposed to such services being provided.







The following is in response to your memorandum of March 21, 2008, requesting this Department's determination that the proposed Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District conforms or conflicts with the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP).

The applicant is requesting a special taxing district to facilitate a proposed roving patrol for the area/neighborhood located generally between NE 199 and NE 185 Streets and between NE 18 and NE 22 Avenues, comprising the northernmost portion of the City of North Miami Beach and portions of unincorporated Miami-Dade County. Staff has reviewed the request for establishing a special taxing district and finds that there are no conflicts with the CDMP; therefore, the Department has no objection to the proposal.

It should be noted that the area subject to this request was the object of a previous petition, which sought to establish the Sky Lake Security Guard Special Taxing District. This request was denied by the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (BCC) in March 2007 due to non-compliance with the CDMP and the negative effects on homes located near the three proposed guard house sites. The previous petition proposed to restrict points of ingress/egress to the neighborhood through the construction of three guardhouses and eleven barricades across the roadways accessing the neighborhood. The attached County Manager's memo dated March 20, 2007, to the Honorable Chairman Bruno A. Barreiro and members of the BCC includes a background and an outline of actions on the previous petition leading up to the BCC's March 2007 hearing.

A petition submitted to Miami-Dade County for the creation of a special taxing district to be known as the Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District was presented in accordance with the requirements of Article 1, Chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

The proposed district is located within portions of unincorporated Miami-Dade County and the City of North Miami Beach, and its boundaries are set forth as follows:

On the North, N.E. 199th Street;
On the East, N.E. 22nd Avenue;
On the South, NE 185th Street;
On the West, N.E. 18th Avenue.

The boundaries are shown on the attached plan entitled Sky Lake Roving Patrol Security Guard Special Taxing District and hereinafter referred to as Exhibit A.

The purpose of the petition is to provide a roving security patrol service, to consist of one off-duty police officer operating from a mobile patrol unit, 24 hours per day, 365 days a year.
