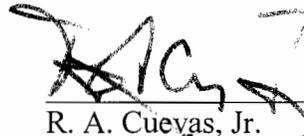

RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO REAUTHORIZE THE FEDERAL SAFETEA-LU TRANSPORTATION SPENDING PACKAGE IN 2009 WITH A SUBSTANTIALLY HIGHER FUNDING AUTHORIZATION THAN WAS INCLUDED IN THE 2005 SAFETEA-LU PACKAGE; DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A REPORT FROM WHICH THE BOARD CAN PRIORITIZE THE COUNTY'S FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION FUNDING PROJECTS AND DEVELOP A STRATEGY FOR MAXIMIZING COUNTY FUNDING FROM THE 2009 REAUTHORIZATION OF SAFETEA-LU

WHEREAS, in 2005, the U.S. Congress passed, and the President signed into law, H.R. 3, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)(Public Law 109-59); and

WHEREAS, SAFETEA-LU authorized \$286 billion in spending on federal surface transportation programs for highways, highway safety, and transit for the 5-year period from 2005 to 2009; and

WHEREAS, SAFETEA-LU included funding for approximately 7,000 projects for local governments; and

WHEREAS, Congress is planning to reauthorize SAFETEA-LU in 2009; and

WHEREAS, House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chairman James Oberstar recently indicated that the 2009 reauthorization of SAFETEA-LU could total as much as \$450 billion, which is almost double the authorization included in the 2005 SAFETEA-LU, while Ranking Member John Mica indicated that he would like the 2009 reauthorization to provide up to \$1 trillion or more in transportation funding; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 reauthorization of SAFETEA-LU is likely to authorize substantially more dollars in federal transportation funds than were available under 2005 SAFETEA-LU; and

WHEREAS, Congress only considers the transportation reauthorization bill every six (6) years, so it is imperative that the County develop a strategy and begin considering now which projects the County should submit for consideration as part of the 2009 reauthorization of SAFETEA-LU,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges Congress to reauthorize the federal SAFETEA-LU transportation spending package in 2009 with a substantially higher funding authorization than was included in the 2005 SAFETEA-LU package.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or Designee to prepare a report for presentation to this Board within 120 days of the effective date of this resolution, on County transportation projects that might be appropriate for federal funding so the Board can prioritize the County's federal transportation funding projects and develop a strategy to maximize funding to the County related to the 2009 reauthorization of SAFETEA-LU.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation.

Section 4. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2009 Federal Legislative Package.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
