Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Two Competitive Contracts

Agenda Item No.8(O)(1)(D)

This package, listed as Agenda Item No. 3(F) on the July 8, 2008 Budget and Finance Committee meeting agenda, was amended due to a scrivener's error in Item 1.1 to increase the allocation for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department from \$1,250 to \$12,500, changing the total contract value from \$1,184,029 to \$1,195,279.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of two competitive contracts, with authority to exercise options-to-renew. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package states the allocation amount and funding source for each department utilizing a contract. **Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.**

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or his designee will have the authority to exercise in his discretion subsequent options-to-renew and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

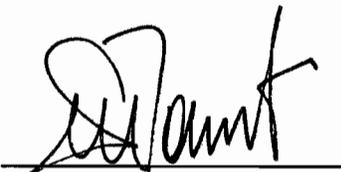
Background

Section 1 Award of Competitive Bids

The contracts listed in this section, are being recommended for award to the lowest priced, responsive, responsible bidder who met the bid specifications in accordance with established policies and procedures.

Item 1.1: Medical Supplies is to award a contract to purchase medical supplies for various County Departments. The amount being requested is **\$1,195,279**.

Item 1.2: Vehicle Rental Services is to award for vehicle rental services for the Miami-Dade Police Department and General Services Administration. The amount being requested is **\$3,863,690**.

VENDOR(S) NOT RECOMMENDED FOR AWARD:

AMFAK, Inc. and Fivera Consulting & Management Services (local vendors), and Laerdal, and Port City Medical (non-local vendors) submitted prices which were higher than the pricing being recommended for award.

School Health (non-local vendor) is non-responsive because the vendor took exception to Section 2, Paragraph 2.7 and would not hold firm pricing for the entire term of the contract.

Surgimed Corporation (local vendor) is non-responsive because the vendor did not provide the reference required in Section 2, Paragraph 2.6.

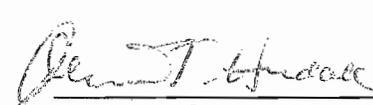
The Living Wage Ordinance is not applicable to this contract.

BACKGROUND

This contract will replace a current contract, which expires on August 31, 2008. Purchase of a three-month supply of items is being processed to ensure continuity of supply while this award is approved. This contract is primarily used by the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department to purchase medical supplies for emergency medical response teams. Award is recommended to the three lowest priced responsive, responsible bidders as primary, secondary and tertiary on a group-by-group basis.

The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Bid Preference and Local Preference Ordinances were applied, which resulted in the award of American Medical Depot, the only certified SBE bidder, as primary vendor in Groups 9 and 25 and secondary vendor in Groups 24 and 32.

BACKGROUND

This contract will allow rental of different makes and models of cars, vans, pick up trucks and utility vehicles for the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) and General Services Administration (GSA). MDPD rents vehicles for surveillance work and GSA rents vehicles for special events on an as needed basis.

This contract is being awarded, by group, to the two lowest responsive, responsible bidders. The solicitation contains five Groups: Group A (subcompact and compact two-door and four-door cars), Group B (mid-size full-size and luxury cars), Group C (vans and utility vehicles), Group D (15 passenger vans) and Group E (pick-up trucks).

The Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference and the Local Preference were applied in accordance with the applicable ordinances. This contract will replace an existing contract which expires on October 31, 2008.
