**Subject:** Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Competitively Bid Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract Value to More than \$1 Million

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in his discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item when in the best interest of Miami-Dade County. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

## Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

## Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying OTR package states the allocation amount and funding source for each department utilizing a contract. **Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.**

## Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying OTR package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

## Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

## Background

The competitively bid contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

**Item No. 1: Uniform Rental with Laundry Services** seeks authority to ratify the execution of the first OTR period for a contract to purchase rental of uniforms and the collection, laundering and delivery for Miami-Dade Transit, Seaport and Miami-Dade Water and Sewer departments. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$740,000**.

**Item No. 2: Refurbished Telecommunications Equipment, Pre-qualification of Vendors** seeks authority to exercise the second OTR period for a contract to purchase refurbished telecommunications equipment for the Enterprise Technology Services Department. The amount being requested for the second option year is **\$400,000**.

**Item No. 3: Transportation Services** seeks authority to exercise the fourth OTR period for a contract to purchase transportation services for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department. The amount being requested for the fourth option year is **\$250,000**.

**Item No. 4: Bell Joint and Pipe Repair Clamps and Couplings** seeks authority to exercise the second OTR period for a contract to purchase bell joints and pipe repair clamps and couplings for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. The amount being requested for the second option year is **\$450,000**.

**Item No. 5: Inmate Scrub Sets** seeks authority to exercise the second OTR period for a contract to purchase inmate scrub sets for the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department. The amount being requested for the second option year is **\$400,000**.

**Item No. 6: Clearview Mattresses and Pillows** seeks authority to exercise the second OTR period for a contract to purchase clearview mattresses and pillows for the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department. The amount being requested for the second option year is **\$350,000**.

**Item No. 7: Package Terminal Air Conditioners and Dehumidifiers** seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period to purchase package terminal air conditioners, dehumidifying equipment, and accessories for Miami-Dade Housing Agency. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$200,000**.

**Item No. 8: Executive Search and Consulting Services Pool** seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for a contract to allow the Human Resources Department to purchase Executive Search and Consulting Services. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$300,000**.

### **JUSTIFICATION**

This uniform rental and laundry services contract was awarded on October 1, 2006 for a one-year period, with four, one-year Options-to-Renew (OTR), with an allocation of \$250,000 for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD). During the initial contract term, three modifications were issued totaling \$419,707. This increased the total contract value to \$669,707.

- The first modification was issued in January 2007 to increase WASD's allocation by \$239,707.
- The second two modifications were issued in June and July 2007, to add the Seaport Department and Miami-Dade Transit to the contract with an additional allocation of \$180,000. The contract that these two departments were utilizing was terminated for default of the awarded vendor, Unifirst, Inc.

Because of these three modifications, the execution of the first OTR in the amount of \$669,707 would bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million. Not having sufficient time to meet the September 2007 agenda deadlines and in order to ensure continuity of services, the first OTR was exercised with an allocation of \$250,000 bringing the cumulative value of the contract to \$919,707. Staff inadvertently approved a subsequent modification of \$250,000, which brought the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million.

This item is presented to the Board for ratification of the first OTR period. This contract was extended for time only through October 31, 2008 to allow for the commencement of the replacement contract in November 2008.

**JUSTIFICATION**

The purpose of this contract is to obtain fixed route shuttle full-size bus and minibus service from qualified contractor(s) for a tennis tournament held annually in Crandon Park at Key Biscayne. The shuttle bus service route is from Virginia Beach to the running track at Crandon Park. The vendor provides all tolls, labor, equipment, supplies and facilities required to operate this service.

This contract is utilized by the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department to purchase clear mattresses and pillows for inmates. Market research indicates that it is in the County's best interest to exercise the second Option-to-Renew (OTR) period. The vinyl used in the manufacturing of the mattresses is a petroleum based product. It is anticipated that prices resulting from a new competitive process will result in a significant increase from current contract prices due to ongoing increases in petroleum and petroleum by-products used to manufacture these goods. Exercising the second OTR limits the price increase to 5.3 percent based on the Consumer Price Index for the Miami area.
