



RESOLUTION RETROACTIVELY AUTHORIZING IN-KIND SERVICES FROM THE MIAMI-DADE PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT AND THE MIAMI-DADE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE SEPTEMBER 21, 2008 “20th ANNIVERSARY CUBAN EXODUS RELIEF PROJECT” SPONSORED BY FOUNDATION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS IN CUBA, INC., A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,215.00 TO BE FUNDED FROM THE DISTRICT 10 IN-KIND RESERVE FUND





Cuban Exodus Relief Fund, Inc.

Since 1959, more than 925,000 Cuban refugees have been admitted to the United States, including the 125,000 Cubans who arrived during the Mariel boatlift in 1980. In 1984, the Cuban American National Foundation began providing humanitarian aid in the form of food, shelter, education and medical assistance to Cuban refugees stranded in third countries without legal status and awaiting approval for entry into the United States. Through its Cuban Exodus Relief Fund project, CANF distributed to these exiles over \$4 million raised through direct mailings and various radio and telethons held across the country.

On June 13, 1988, CANF signed an historic agreement with the U.S. Department of State and the Immigration and Naturalization Service that allowed up to 1,500 Cubans stranded in third countries to immediately emigrate to the U.S., with an additional 1,500 every year thereafter. The agreement was based on a 1986 Administration decision to permit the private sector to sponsor as many as 4,000 refugees annually -- the Private Sector Initiative (PSI). The PSI Program was unique in that individual sponsors, in coordination with the Foundation, guarantee shelter, employment and medical insurance, as well as other basic necessities in order to ensure that local, state and federal government funds are not used for resettlement.

As of the end of 1991, the Cuban American National Foundation had privately resettled more than 8,600 Cuban refugees at no cost to the Federal Government. These refugees were stranded in third countries such as Panama, Costa Rica and Spain, among many others, after fleeing the totalitarian government of Fidel Castro. In just under three years,

CANF's model Private Sector Initiative Program has provided an impressive net savings of over \$35 million to U.S. taxpayers.

In March 1991, the Cuban Exodus Relief Fund was incorporated as an independent, non-profit organization dedicated to processing and assisting in the private resettlement and family reunification of Cuban refugees directly from Cuba and from third countries into the United States. The Cuban Exodus Relief Fund's development of a nationwide placement and resettlement services program has its basis in the years of outreach work done by the CANF organization and its individual Directors throughout the United States. Individual Directors of the Foundation have had a long-standing humanitarian tradition of assisting Cuban refugees in many Cuban-American communities in the United States. The success of the CANF Private Sector Initiative Program has also been due in large part to the goodwill generated and cash in-kind services support provided by these Cuban-American communities. An indicative measure of support has been the active participation by these communities in annual fundraising radio and telethons in Miami, Orlando, Tampa, Newark, New York City, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Boston and Houston, among other cities.



Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is in response to your request for a copy of your organization's determination letter. We have placed a copy of the letter in the envelope and will take the place of the copy you requested.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in April 1986, granted your organization a ruling from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as described in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operation, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, each year if gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee each calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 4 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Recommendation

The Office of Strategic Business Management (OSBM) has reviewed the attached in-kind request and recommends for the item to move forward to the Board of County Commissioners for consideration. The district specific in-kind reserve balance allows for the funding of this request.

Background

A retroactive waiver for in-kind services is being requested by a not-for-profit organization the Foundation for Human Rights in Cuba, Inc. for their 20th Anniversary Cuban Exodus Relief Project event held on September 21, 2008.

In-kind services have been requested in an amount not to exceed \$4,182 from the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department for the use of the Tropical Park – Equestrian Center and \$1,033 from the Miami-Dade Police Department for personnel services, for a total in-kind amount of \$5,215. This event will be funded from District 10 in-kind reserve fund.

In FY 2007-08, the Foundation for Human Rights in Cuba, Inc. has received no county funding for this event.
