

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION DIRECTING MAYOR OR MAYOR'S
DESIGNEE TO ANALYZE THE FEASIBILITY AND
ADVISABILITY OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY USING
ALTERNATIVE FUEL VEHICLES WHICH ARE FUELED BY
COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS

WHEREAS, alternative fuel vehicles which use compressed natural gas ("CNG") may provide a viable alternative to vehicles which utilize traditional fuels such as diesel and gasoline; and

WHEREAS, the price of gasoline and diesel has risen dramatically in the past 24 months and Miami-Dade County is currently paying \$3.33 and \$3.58 per gallon, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the cost of CNG is significantly lower than diesel and gasoline, ranging from an average of \$0.63 per gallon equivalent in Utah to \$2.50 per gallon equivalent in California; and

WHEREAS, natural gas is clean burning and produces significantly fewer harmful emissions than reformulated gasoline; and

WHEREAS, compared with vehicles fueled with conventional diesel and gasoline, some natural gas vehicle owners report service lives two to three years longer than gasoline or diesel vehicles, and extended time between required maintenance; and

WHEREAS, natural gas vehicles can produce significantly lower amounts of harmful emissions; and

WHEREAS, more than ninety percent of natural gas used in the United States is produced in North America; and

WHEREAS, cities such as San Diego, Los Angeles, Atlanta, New York, and Hollywood, Florida currently use CNG buses in their transit fleets; and

WHEREAS, the Commission believes that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Miami-Dade County to study the feasibility and advisability of utilizing CNG vehicles,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Mayor or Mayor's designee is directed to study the feasibility and advisability of utilizing compressed natural gas in County vehicles, including transit vehicles. The report shall include, but not be limited to: possible conversion of current vehicles; purchase of new vehicles; hybrid CNG technology; infrastructure costs to dispense CNG; the availability of natural gas; and any possible funding sources, including federal and state grants. The Mayor shall submit a report regarding his findings and recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Carlos A. Gimenez.
