

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION INVOKING WAIVER PROVIDED BY ORDINANCE 05-114 OF PROCEDURES FOR DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY ON THE BASIS OF THE FINDING THAT AN EMERGENCY SITUATION EXISTS IN HAITI AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO DONATE SURPLUS EARTH-MOVING EQUIPMENT AND REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD IN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2005, the Board enacted Ordinance 05-114 to amend Section 2-11.2.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County for the express purpose of waiving the procedures relating to the disposition of surplus property “in the event of an emergency situation outside of Miami-Dade County;” and

WHEREAS, in Haiti during the 2008 hurricane season four consecutive storms have left at least 425 people dead, tens of thousands homeless, and wiped out more than \$180 million in crops; and

WHEREAS, information has been received from Haiti that there is an emergency situation regarding debris pickup and removal that if not remedied may promote the spread of diseases and social unrest which may affect the health and welfare of Miami-Dade County given Haiti’s geographic proximity and the extensive volume of trade and travel between Haiti and Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, these storms have damaged bridges and roads making the delivery of food, water and medical supplies difficult; and

WHEREAS, the situation in Haiti is so dire that on September 19, 2008, local immigration officials announced that the federal government would temporarily halt the deportation of Haitians from South Florida; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds that the devastation wrought on Haiti by the combined effects of the hurricanes during the 2008 hurricane season have created an emergency situation in Haiti that demands action and assistance from governments and non-governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, to the extent the County has surplus earth-moving equipment that could be donated to Haiti for the purpose of alleviating the emergency situation there, the Board finds that there is an emergency situation in Haiti that warrants the exercise of the waiver authority granted to the Board under Ordinance 05-114 so that such donations can be effectuated,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board finds and declares that an emergency situation exists in Haiti that warrants the waiver authorized by Ordinance 05-114 of the procedures for disposition of surplus property >>for a period of ninety (90) days<<¹ and directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to promptly identify and donate surplus earth-moving equipment to Haiti as expeditiously as possible and to report back to the Board regarding such donations within fifteen (15) days.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Dorrin D. Rolle. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
