Subject: Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department Emergency Medical Services Rate Schedule

Agenda Item No. 8(C)(1)(J)

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve an adjustment to the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department's (MDFR) emergency medical services (EMS) rate schedule by conforming the Basic Life Support (BLS) Emergency, Advanced Life Support 1 (ALS1) and Advanced Life Support 2 (ALS2) rates to the Medicare allowable rates for those categories of services, and increasing the mileage rate from \$7.50 to \$10 per mile. All other rates remain unchanged.

SCOPE

This proposed resolution has a countywide impact.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

MDFR estimates additional revenues of approximately \$460,000 annually based on the new rate schedule. Specific rates changes are detailed in the background section of this recommendation.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

The Consumer Services Department (CSD) is responsible for regulating for-hire transportation, including ambulance services.

BACKGROUND

Chapter 4, Article I of the Miami-Dade County Code, sets forth regulations governing air and ground ambulances and emergency medical transport vehicles. Pursuant to Section 4-7, all rates charged for the transportation of persons in these units shall be established by the Board after public hearing. No other rates may be charged except as provided in Section 4-7(a), which includes rates as may be determined by Federal law.

The current EMS rate schedule for MDFR has been in place since July 2003. Since that time, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) has risen 30 percent. In addition, since 2003 the existing rates have not been adjusted for increases in the cost of fuel, staffing, health care supplies, and emergency vehicles. During the last five years, the average salary for International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) bargaining unit personnel has increased 42 percent, medical supply costs have increased 40 percent and fuel costs have more than doubled.

Currently, MDFR rates are lower than the allowable Medicare reimbursement rates, which results in forfeiture of funds that could legitimately be collected by MDFR from Medicare. MDFR's current schedule is \$9 less than the current rate allowed under Medicare for BLS, \$23 less for ALS1, and \$93 less for ALS2. Therefore, MDFR has requested a revised EMS schedule to conform the rates for BLS, ALS1 and ALS2 to the Medicare allowable rates for those service categories and increases the mileage rate from \$7.50 to \$10 per mile. The rates for Specialty Care Transport, supplies, drugs and procedures will remain unchanged. In addition, MDFR has requested that these rates be automatically adjusted to

the Medicare allowable rates every time the rates change. Under the Medicare rules, these rates are annually adjusted on January 1st to account for inflation. This annual update is based on the percentage increase in the CPI for all urban consumers for the 12-month period ending in June of the prior year.

The proposed schedule of rates per patient is as follows:

Last year, MDRR transported 70,000 people. Approximately 31 percent of the trips were BLS, 67 percent were ALS1 and 2 percent were ALS2. The proposed schedule will have minimal impact on consumers because ambulance transports are typically paid by Medicare, Medicaid and private insurance. According to MDRR's records, 31 percent of their collections are Medicare related; 10 percent Medicaid; 53 percent private insurance; and 6 percent private pay. Under its "hardship program," MDRR provides a write-off of up to \$500 to uninsured or underinsured patients who meet the federal poverty guidelines and are unable to pay for services. Their overall collection rate is 60 percent.

In the case of a Medicare transport, Medicare pays 80 percent of the allowable rate. The remaining 20 percent represents the co-pay amount, which is submitted to a patient's secondary insurance or Medicaid (if applicable), or billed directly to the patient. Medicare will not pay more than their allowable rate regardless of the local fee structure. The Medicare co-pay under the proposed rates is \$67.86 for BLS trips, \$80.50 for ALS1 trips and \$116.64 for ALS2 trips. This represents a minimal increase in the co-pay from the current schedule of \$1.84 for BLS, \$4.50 for ALS1, and \$18.64 for ALS2. These amounts would increase by the CPI factor each year with the annual Medicare adjustment.

The revised rate schedule will have no impact on Medicaid clients. Medicaid pays a flat rate of \$136 for BLS trips and \$190 for ALS1 and ALS2 trips. Ambulance providers cannot bill the client for the difference.

A comparison of ambulance and emergency medical service rates in Florida and nationally is attached. The revised rates remain consistent with or lower than the various rates around Florida and nationally
