WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners (“Board”) enacted Section 17-149, *et seq.* of the Code of Miami-Dade County (“Code”), which created the Community Affordable Housing Strategies Alliance (“CAHSA”); and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. R-588-08 CAHSA board members were appointed by the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Section 17-149(a)(15) of the Code requires one (1) representative from the Miami-Dade Affordable Housing Advisory Board to serve as a member of CAHSA ; and

WHEREAS, during the October 8, 2008 AHAB, Amory Bodin was selected unanimously by the AHAB to serve as a member of CAHSA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Code alternate members may be appointed by this Board; and

WHEREAS, the resumes of Mr. Bodin and the candidates for alternate membership, are attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to appoint Amory Bodin and each of the candidates for alternate membership to CAHSA,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby:


