FDOT ROAD PROJECT IMPACT TO TROPICAL PARK

Presented

Report: *Mr. Jack Kardys, Director, Park & Recreation Department (MDPR) provided a brief overview regarding the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) project impact to Tropical Park. He noted he and his staff reviewed the plans for widening Bird Road. Mr. Kardys pointed out that the impacts occurred east of the main entrance to the park and it may be necessary to provide minor realignment to the east bound turn lane or some minor adjustments to some of the sidewalks; however, the major impact was to the width of the existing sidewalk or FDOT right-of-way. Consequently, the sidewalks would be restored as part of the roadway improvements and the FDOT would work with staff to adjust the County's sidewalks/walkways to ensure they were compatible and code compliant. Also, FDOT has assured staff that they would replace any landscaping that was damaged as a result of the improvements.*

Chairman Souto expressed concern regarding the significant increase in traffic on Bird Road due to the tremendous population growth in the area as well as the growth in the student population at Florida International University, which has made it very unsafe for pedestrians to cross Bird Road. He suggested the traffic signals be adjusted to allow enough time for pedestrians to cross.

Mr. Kardys responded to Chairman Souto's concerns regarding pedestrians and the traffic signals noting that MDPR would work in conjunction with FDOT to make sure the traffic signals were coordinated to allow pedestrians sufficient time to cross the street.

Chairman Souto noted that expanding Bird Road to eight lanes would make the road more dangerous for pedestrians. He asked Mr. Gus Pego, District Secretary, FDOT to consider constructing a crosswalk bridge at the entrance of Tropical Park.

In response to Chairman Souto's inquiry regarding the possibility of constructing a crosswalk bridge at the entrance of Tropical Park, Mr. Pego concurred with Chairman Souto's concerns regarding the safety of pedestrians. He

noted; however, that a crosswalk bridge had various constraints and was problematic. Mr. Pego noted that the plans were still conceptual and once completing an inspection of the traffic signals timing cycles, the department would conduct further inspection to determine the need for a crosswalk bridge. He said that the FDOT would share the results of the inspections with the Public Works Department Director and Chairman Souto and/or his staff. Mr. Pego said FDOT's engineers would determine whether or not a crosswalk bridge was needed.

Commissioner Moss noted that he worked with the Community Image Advisory Board and Mr. Pego who were both extremely responsive. He further noted he would work with Chairman Souto to address his concerns and come up with some solutions.

Commissioner Jordan noted that she would like to have a discussion with Mr. Pego regarding the widening of 47th Avenue and how that could be incorporated within planning.

He noted that funding was in place for construction; however, the issue with budget adjustments, which primarily resulted from reductions in State funding impacted the operations budget for this project as well as some other existing and future projects. Mr. Munoz explained that funding was available to build these projects, but not to operate them. He noted staff was in the process of developing plans to provide staffing and programming for parks.*

In response to Commissioner Moss' inquiry regarding the projected completion date of constructing the subject project, Mr. Jack Kardys, Director, Park & Recreation Department stated it would take approximately 5 years to complete.

Commissioner Moss stated that the completion date of the project was so far out that funds should be available to operate the facility upon its completion and suggested that the commission move ahead with the project.

Report: *Mr. Jack Kardys, Director, Park & Recreation Department, provided a report regarding the 2009 Miami International Agriculture and Cattle Show. Mr. Kardys said the show was scheduled for March 20th through 22nd at the Ronald Regan Equestrian Center at Tropical Park. Mr. Kardys said he and staff were holding bi-weekly meetings with the steering committee and that the website for the show was live. Mr. Kardys noted the sponsorship packages ranged from \$2,500 to \$25,000 and that Okeechobee Farmland had signed onto the show as a \$5000 silver sponsor. He said marketing within trade publications were running through December until March. Mr. Kardys said that Mexico, Columbia, Venezuela, Chile, Brazil and Ecuador were Latin American targets to market the show to. The educational component of the show would be held in a large air conditioned tent this year on-site rather than having an off-site education seminar which helped integrate the show and gave more value to the sponsors.*

Mr. Charles Lapradd, Agricultural Management, Department of Planning & Zoning gave further details regarding the 2009 Miami International Agriculture and Cattle Show. He noted that representatives from the Florida Nursery Growers & Landscapers Association's Miami Chapter were interested in participating in the Agriculture and Cattle show in conjunction with their own homestead plant exposition. He noted that he had met with International Trade Commission (ITC) and the Inter-American Institute for the Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) regarding inbound trade missions and their participation in the educational component of the show. Mr. Lapradd said that he held a workshop in September with approximately 30 growers that were interested in showcasing their product at the farmer's market at the show. He said he had visited many of the local agricultural trade organizations and had handed out many brochures for the show. Mr. Lapradd said he recently visited the Sunbelt Agricultural

Exposition which was the largest Agricultural Trade show in the Southeast United States where he passed out more brochures; he said the show had a large exhibit of goats as well as poultry and he expected some of the same sponsors and attendees at Miami's show. Mr. Lapradd pointed out that he had attended a workshop regarding goat marketing at the Sunbelt show and noted that attendees had many questions regarding sale and purchase of goats, goat products and goat marketing in South Florida, Mr. Lapradd said this prompted him to explore adding a goat exhibition to Miami's show.

Chairman Souto asked Mr. Lapradd to explore Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University's (FAMU) small ruminant programs to obtain further information regarding the goat product market.

Report: *Mr. Jack Kardys, Director, Park & Recreation Department (MDPR), provided a status report regarding concessions for horseback riding at the Tropical Park Equestrian Center. Mr. Kardys noted that he met with the Equestrian Task Force (ETF) staff to gauge what the impact would be if MDPR put a block of stalls up for rent. ETF staff members noted concern regarding the impact to the 30 to 35 shows that were held at the Equestrian Center. Mr. Kardys noted that his staff was considering putting additional portable stalls in the area where pavilions were currently located. Mr. Kardys said his staff had met with the Creative Children Therapy Inc. regarding bringing three horses into the Equestrian Center to provide therapeutic riding for disabled children. He said since Creative Children Therapy was a non-profit group they could enter into an annual permit then a Request For Proposals (RFP) to non-profits in the future.*

With regard to sailboat rentals in Tropical Park, Mr. Kardys noted that the current vendor within the park had priced storage of the boats and other aspects of renting sailboats and decided he would not be able to provide the service. Upon searching for other vendors to provide sailboat rentals, Mr. Kardys said he realized that a floating dock system needed to be in place for accessibility purposes. He noted that prices on the floating dock system and ramps were estimated anywhere from \$80,000 to \$100,000. Mr. Kardys noted that he had a draft RFP for a Master Concession Agreement which would go to procurement within the next 30 days which included food, bicycle rental, water bikes, sailboats and kayak rental operations under one master lease agreement.
