RESOLUTION APPOINTING OTIS PITTS, REVEREND DR. R. JOACQUIN WILLIS, WILLIAM WALLACE, IV, AND HANEEF QAID HAMIDULLAH TO BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR N.W. 7TH AVENUE CORRIDOR COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") adopted Ordinance No. 06-18 previously adopted Ordinance No. 06-18, which established the N.W. 7th Avenue Corridor Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA") and appointed an initial Board of Commissioners ("CRA Board") pursuant to Section 163.356, Florida Statutes ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Board, as governing body of the CRA, makes appointments to the CRA Board, when necessary, after the initial CRA Board is established; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to fill vacancies on the CRA Board; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to appoint Otis Pitts, Reverend Dr. R. Joaquin Willis, William Wallace, IV, and Haneef Qaid Hamidullah, whose resumes are attached hereto as Exhibit A, to serve as commissioners of the CRA Board,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, the Board appoints to the Board of Commissioners for the N.W. 7th Avenue Corridor Community Redevelopment Agency Otis Pitts, Reverend Dr. R. Joaquin Willis, Wallace, IV, and Haneef Qaid Hamidullah, each of whom will serve a four (4) year term.

Rev. Dr. R. Joaquin Willis

Since 2002, Dr. Willis has served as the Pastor of the Church of the Open Door Congregational, United Church of Christ (UCC), in Miami, Florida. He was called to service at the church because he is both youth and community-oriented. He envisions the church as being responsible for *“captivating and empowering God’s community.”* Dr. Willis is the official representative, on the National Board of Directors for the Local Church Ministries of the United Church of Christ, of the Ministers for Racial, Social, and Economic Justice, (MRSEJ).

Dr. Willis’ ministry extends far beyond the church walls. He is an Adjunct Professor of Old Testament Scriptures at Florida International University (FIU); he is the Board President of the CBG (Collective Banking Group of Miami-Dade & Vicinity Inc.), and is a member of the Board of Directors for National Collective Banking Group, Inc. The CBG (in Miami-Dade and vicinity), is an ecumenical collective of over 60 Christian churches who are in covenant with six local banks working together for the purpose of insuring churches and their members receive equitable treatment in acquiring loans and other banking-related services. Pastor Willis also serves on the Board of Directors for the Belafonte TACOLCY Center, Inc., and the 79th Street Corridor Initiative, Inc., both of which are Community Development, Inc., both of which are Community Development Corporations.

Dr. Willis was ordained in May 1987 at Peoples Congregational Church in Washington, D.C. where he served from 1978 until 1989, when he was called to become the Founding Pastor of The Amistad UCC in Upper Marlboro, Maryland. In 1999, he served as the coordinating pastor of a multicultural merger between St. Paul UCC (a European congregation), and Amistad UCC (an African American congregation). The new church was called “Amistad St. Paul UCC,” and is located in Lanham, Maryland.

Dr. Willis was born in Brewton, Alabama, and raised in Mobile, until his high school graduation in 1967. He went on to earn three degrees from Howard University: a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science in 1972, a Masters of Divinity in 1985, and a Doctorate of Ministry in 1987. While completing his education, Dr. Willis began working at the age 19, full-time in the computer industry for companies like IBM, Philips, and Xerox Corporations, in the areas of Sales, Sales Training, and Federal and Commercial Sales Management.

Pastor Willis, and his wife Clarissa, share a call to community service and development. They have a blended family of five children, and four grandchildren. Clarissa was born and raised in Louisville, Kentucky, and has been a life-long member of the United Church of Christ. She is the perfect ‘help-mate’ for Pastor Willis. Clarissa is a Commercial Real Estate Broker at CB Richard Ellis, Inc., and is a professional community developer in her own right. The Willis’ enjoy studying the Bible together, as well as tennis, swimming, walking, and reading.



WILLIAM WALLACE IV

William Wallace IV is the Vice President of Development for Biscayne Landing and a partner with Urban Residential Development Group, an affiliate that is responsible for developing workforce housing. In addition to his responsibilities overseeing the fee development of up to 6,000 future workforce housing units in the City of North Miami, Mr. Wallace is responsible for managing the fee development of off-site projects, which include an Olympic Training Facility housing the combative sports of the Olympic National Governing Boards and a new public library.
