Subject: Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Competitively Bid Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract Value to More than \$1 Million

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in his discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item when in the best interest of Miami-Dade County. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying OTR package states the allocation amount and funding source for each department utilizing a contract. **Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.**

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying OTR package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The competitively bid contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: System Furniture Services seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase system furniture services for Miami-Dade Aviation and General Services Administration departments. The amount being requested is **\$3,468,252**.

Item No. 2: Oil / Water Separation Equipment and Water Drainage Filtering Systems (Maintenance and / or Repair) Unskilled seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase services for storm water drainage filtration systems maintenance and repair for Miami-Dade Fire Rescue, General Services Administration, Miami-Dade Transit and Miami-Dade Water and Sewer departments. The amount being requested is **\$2,116,000**.

Item No. 3: Key Punch Services seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase key punch services for the Miami-Dade Fire and Rescue Department. The amount being requested is **\$258,103**.

Item No. 4: Golf Course Green Mixes, Pre-qualification of Vendors seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase golf course green mixes for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department. The amount being requested is **\$600,000**.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is utilized by various County departments to purchase system furniture services. The systems furniture installers will perform specific manual work requiring specialized knowledge, skills and experience. Current assignments under this contract include dismantling, reconfiguring and reassembly of various types of systems furniture, and loading and unloading of system related materials to and from various County facilities.

The allocations requested for this contract are based on the expected usage for projects in the upcoming year. Exercising the Option-to-Renew (OTR) periods will provide continuity of services, and inclusion of the appropriate Consumer Price Index increases. Exercising the OTRs constitutes an overall savings to the County of over 30 percent from the current market price of labor for this service.

The contract is in its initial term which expires on March 31, 2009. Exercising the remaining four OTRs will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$2,645,000.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract provides for the purchase of oil / water separation equipment with maintenance and repair services for water drainage filtration systems. The filtration system filters and suspends storm water pollutants from entering the sewer system at over 200 storm drains on County property. The contractor services the storm drains on a monthly basis and provides needed repairs.

A filtration system is an important part of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System federal permit requirement. The system removes pollutants by suspending them in a filter media housed in boxed frames inside catch basins. The permit requires the proper maintenance of the catch basin drains and yearly sampling and analysis of storm water run-off.

This contract was awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder in the aggregate. The prices are firm and fixed for each term of the contract, with annual price adjustments based on Living Wage increases. It is more cost effective for the County to maintain the existing system then to replace the entire system for a product from a different company. Use of the Sorbant Environmental filtration system is a cost effective solution for maintenance of various sizes and number of catch basins in the County. It is therefore recommended that the Option-to-Renew periods be exercised.

The contract is in its third OTR period which expires on February 28, 2009. Exercising the remaining OTR period will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$1,021,480.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is currently utilized to collect information from hand written field reports created by emergency personnel in the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department (MDFR). The vendor is required to pick up the reports from the County, key punch, and verify information. The vendor then returns the original reports along with a CD-ROM within a specified time frame for a particular job.

The services provided by this contract are mandated by the State of Florida for MDFR's medical record accountability, where MDFR is required to capture information on emergency incident reports. Key punch services are used to collect information from handwritten field reports created by MDFR emergency personnel. This information is used internally for operations protocol compliance and management planning purposes.

Market research was conducted. Market pricing is currently higher than the current contractual rate on the County's contract. It is in the County's best interest to exercise the Option-to-Renew periods.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is utilized by the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department to purchase various green mixes to maintain the greens in County golf courses in excellent condition. This contract was established through an open competitive Invitation to Bid process to establish a pre-qualified pool of vendors for future price competition. Pre-qualified vendors participate in spot market purchases through competitive requests for quotes. Qualified vendors may be added to this pool contract to maximize competition and provide fair market pricing. The spot market bidding process utilized on this contract provides the County with the best opportunity to obtain the most competitive pricing. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the Option-to-Renew periods.
