**Subject:** Resolution Authorizing the Disbursement of \$51,225 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund to Conduct Environmental Enhancement at the Virginia Key Beach Park through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the disbursement of \$51,225 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) to replace a wetlands pedestrian bridge across a tidal channel as part of the ongoing wetlands restoration efforts at the Virginia Key Beach Park, authorized by Resolution R-1227-05, in connection with the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program.

## **Scope**

This BBEETF disbursement request will benefit coastal areas of District 7 (Comm. Gimenez).

## **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

This resolution authorizes the disbursement of funds from the BBEETF for activities that are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF as described in Section 24-40 and the Shoreline Development Review requirements of Chapter 33D-38(4) of the Miami-Dade County Code.


## **Track Record/Monitor**

The Director of the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) will monitor the activities performed with the BBEETF funds. The activities include all project-related tasks including overall program administration, outside funding requests and agreements, contractor selection, contract administration, restoration contract compliance, success monitoring and final reporting.

## **Background**

Under the Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program, DERM conducts various environmental restoration and enhancement activities throughout Biscayne Bay. These highly successful and popular projects are generally implemented on public lands and are assisted financially through various state and federal programs. The requested funds will be used to replace a wetlands pedestrian bridge in association with the wetlands restoration efforts at the Virginia Key Beach Park conducted by DERM and authorized by Resolution R-1227-05. The original bridge was removed to provide access for the removal of sediments with heavy equipment within the historic creek.

The \$51,225 requested to be disbursed are encumbered BBEETF monies that were deposited into the BBEETF by several separate actions by the Shoreline Development Review Committee with conditions requiring these funds be used for public access improvement along Biscayne Bay. DERM will coordinate the funding requests, the contractor selection process, and all of the construction activities. These activities are conducted by outside contractors and County staff members. The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF as described in Section 24-40 and the Shoreline Development Review requirements of Chapter 33D-38(4) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. **Subject:** Recommendation for Disbursement of \$51,225 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund to Conduct Environmental Enhancement at the Virginia Key Beach Park through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program

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Pursuant to Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, I am recommending the disbursement of \$51,225 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) to replace a wetlands pedestrian bridge across a tidal channel as part of the ongoing wetlands restoration at Virginia Key Beach Park previously authorized by Resolution R-1227-05.

This disbursement request is for the construction of a 30 foot long pedestrian bridge replacement over a restored tidal creek associated with an ongoing effort to restore the Virginia Key ecosystems. The original bridge was removed to provide access for the removal of sediments with heavy equipment within the historic creek. The overall ecosystem restoration effort was initiated in September 2008 and includes the restoration of marine wetlands, freshwater wetlands, tropical hardwood hammock, and dune community.

The wetlands restoration component consisted of the selective clearing of all exotic vegetation within approximately 50 acres, the excavating and proper disposal of all materials, the creation of flushing channels, the creation of tidal pools, the planting of mangroves using volunteers from the local community and the installation of an interpretive boardwalk through the restored wetlands.

The objectives of this ongoing project are to restore and enhance the ecological habitats for a wide variety of fish, reptiles, amphibians, birds, and mammals and to provide environmental education to the local community.

These restoration activities are conducted by outside contractors and County staff members. The \$51,225 requested to be disbursed are encumbered BBEETF monies that were deposited into the BBEETF as required by several separate actions by the Shoreline Development Review Committee with conditions requiring these funds be used for public access improvement along Biscayne Bay. The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF as described in Section 24-40 and the Shoreline Development Review requirements of Chapter 33D-38(4) of the Code.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DISBURSEMENT OF \$51,225 FROM THE BISCAYNE BAY ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENT TRUST FUND TO CONDUCT ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENT AT VIRGINIA KEY BEACH PARK THROUGH THE COUNTY'S BISCAYNE BAY RESTORATION AND ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
